




Gravitational lensing


The fact that objects bend space itself is pretty weird, but it does help to explain a few freaky facts that we astrophysicists notice when photographing deep space.

When we use powerful telescopes to take pictures of distant galaxies, the galaxies are sometimes distorted into bizarre streaks, rings or warps. We sometimes even spot the same galaxy multiple times in the same picture! Super weird!

These cosmic distortions happen when something really heavy, like a cluster of galaxies, bends the space around it. We call this bent part of space a gravitational lens. If space is curved, so is the path of the light around it. This can create peculiar images, rings and smudges when we look at an object that lies behind the gravitational lens.

Gravitational waves

Another outcome of bendy space is *gravitational waves*: ripples in space caused by objects speeding up, slowing down or changing direction. We also create gravitational waves when we move, but these disturbances are so incredibly tiny that we don't notice them.

The gravitational waves we can measure are caused by heavy things like black holes or pulsars. When 2 black holes spin around

one another in space, they create gravitational waves that fly off at the speed of light, sending a tiny ripple in all directions that disturbs everything in its path.

Whether it's colossal stars, galaxies or planet Earth, everything is riding these space ripples, like boats bobbing up and down on ocean waves. We don't notice the movement because it's minuscule—a strong gravitational wave shifts things by a thousandth of the width of a proton (which is 0.00000000000000084 metres wide).

Although this distance is unimaginably small, we can

measure it using a gravitational wave detector.

This clever machine uses laser beams reflecting off mirrors to measure incredibly tiny movements as the gravitational wave passes through.

There is still a lot we don't know about gravity, but going on what we've learnt already about its truly bizarre effects, it's going to be a wild ride finding out!

How high can you leap?

In 1993, the Cuban athlete Javier Sotomayor set a new world record by jumping over a bar that was set 245 centimetres above the ground. That's as high as a volleyball net! Find a ruler or measuring tape and see how high 245 centimetres is. Can you imagine soaring through the air like that?

The reason it is so hard to jump that high is an invisible force called **gravity**. It's the same force that makes Earth orbit the Sun, sucks stars into black holes, and creates the vast sea of gravitational waves that ripple across our universe (more about that on page 80).

As with the other forces we met in Chapter 6, scientists try to understand how gravity works so we can know more about the force that shapes planets, moons and pretty much everything else in our universe. Plus, if we can fully understand gravity, maybe we can invent cool things like anti-gravity boots or experience what it is like to float weightless here on Earth! Although we still don't have a perfect explanation of gravity, we've gotten some pretty awesome insights that have helped us to build fairground rides and roller-

coasters, send robotic spacecraft to distant planets, and even land people on the Moon!

Gravity acts on anything with mass

Mass is the amount of 'stuff' that an object contains. The lightest particle we know is the up quark. 3 million trillion of them would weigh 1 kilogram – that's the same as a bag of flour. The mass of a car is around 1000 kilograms. The mass of Earth is a whopping 5.9 trillion trillion kilograms. All these objects create a gravitational pull that depends on their size. The greater the mass, the stronger the gravitational pull.

Where does mass come from?

In the 1960s, scientists started thinking that the universe may be filled with an invisible field of energy that they called the Higgs field (named after Peter Higgs, one of the scientists). The idea was that this Higgs field creates particles called *Higgs bosons*, which quickly pop in and out of existence. These are force particles, just like photons, gluons, and W and Z bosons.

This theory predicted that when a particle interacts with this invisible energy field, it gets a certain amount of mass, depending on what sort of

COSMIC FACT

Mass and weight are not the same thing. On Earth, we often talk about how much something weighs, but weight depends on where you are. On the Moon, you weigh about one-sixth of what you do here on Earth. That's because the Moon is so much smaller than Earth, so its gravitational pull is also smaller. Your mass never changes because it is a universal measure of how much 'stuff' you have in your body.

particle it is. Without the Higgs field, nothing would weigh anything and all particles would fly around at the speed of light!

QUARKS, SPARKS AND QUANTUM MYSTERIES

In 2012, the Higgs boson was finally proven after a 48-year search. Scientists at the CERN (European Council for Nuclear Research) particle physics laboratory in Geneva, Switzerland, smashed protons together as hard as they could and studied the particles created by these collisions. They knew that if the Higgs field existed, about 1 in a billion collisions would create a Higgs boson. They smashed protons together for years – and eventually a few popped out! The Higgs bosons had exactly the properties – the mass, spin, charge and colour charge – that the scientists had predicted, which proved that the Higgs field really does exist.

Down with gravity!

So now we know that mass comes from the Higgs field. But what exactly is gravity?

The most accurate scientific description of gravity is called the *general theory of relativity*, which Albert Einstein figured out more than 100 years ago. Like most scientific theories, it contains a lot of maths, but there are other ways of thinking about it that make it easier to understand.


The basic rule is this: gravity is really just a curved region of space which makes 2 objects fall towards one another. And how exactly does space get curved? Any massive object bends the space around it. We can imagine this as a bowling ball sitting on a trampoline. The heavy ball makes a 'dimple' in the mat. When a marble rolls along the surface of the trampoline, it falls towards the bowling ball – or if it is moving at speed, it falls in a curved path around it.

Does this remind you of anything?

It makes me think about our solar system. The Sun is the bowling ball and the planets are the marbles orbiting around it. However, unlike on the trampoline, in space the planets don't fall into the Sun. They just keep on orbiting pretty much forever.

MASS, GRAVITY, AND RELATIVITY

Each planet creates its own dimple too, capturing moons and even asteroids – in the case of Mars – in their curved surroundings.



NOTES FOR THE INTERESTED READER


While on your journey through the quantum world, you may come across something that looks like this table. This is part of the **periodic table of the elements**. Each square represents a chemical element – a substance made of a single type of atom.

The numbers in the squares are the number of protons each element has. For example, an atom with 1 proton is hydrogen, an atom with 8 protons is oxygen and an atom with 19 protons is potassium.

The letters in each square represent the atomic symbol, which is an abbreviation of the element's name. You might be thinking: why is potassium's symbol a K when there is no K in potassium? That's because the abbreviations come from the element's Latin (an ancient language) name. In this case, the Latin name for potassium is kalium.

This periodic table includes the first 20 elements, but the full periodic table has 118 elements! The very first version of the periodic table was written down in the year 1869.















GENETIC DIVERSITY

EVER WONDERED WHY ONE PERSON CAN LOOK SO DIFFERENT TO ANOTHER?

The answer lies in our genes. Genetic diversity is the variety of genes within a species.

Genes are the instruction manuals for how a body grows and works. They are passed on
from parents to offspring and are the information centres for all life.

DIFFERENCES MAKE US STRONGER

Genes express themselves as traits. For example, you might have curly black hair, and your friend might have straight blonde hair. You both have different genes that have made those traits appear.

The more genetically diverse the population of a species is, the healthier that population tends to be. Individuals in a genetically diverse population will have different strengths and weaknesses, which makes the species more adaptable to changes in their environment and more resilient to disease.



THE MUTATING MUSHROOM

Out of all the organisms on Earth, the split gill mushroom is the most genetically diverse species known today, it has a very large and widespread population, and can be found on every continent except Antarctica. But the biggest reason for its diverse genetics is how often genetic mutation occurs.

A genetic mutation happens when the instruction manual – or code – inside a gene changes or becomes damaged. This leads to new genetic traits developing, as the organism's cells receive new instructions on how they should grow from the gene. The split gill mushroom has an unusually high mutation rate, making it especially genetically diverse.




SAFETY IN NUMBERS

Genetic diversity is important when it comes to conservation projects (see pages 32-33). Scientists estimate that in order to maintain a healthy level of genetic diversity, each population of a species needs to contain at least 500 individuals, and some argue there needs to be even more than that.

At one time, there were only 6 Bali starlings left in the wild.

That number rose to over 50 with the help of conservation work. However, as they had bred from such low numbers, their genetic diversity is very low. Starlings from different zoos and conservation centres are now being bred so their offspring can be released into the wild population to help boost its genetic diversity and keep it healthy.





THE ROMAN CLONE

The negative effects of low genetic diversity can be seen in the English elm tree. Brought to the UK 2,000 years ago by the Romans, every English elm is genetically the same tree as its ancient ancestors. The tree is not very effective at spreading seeds, so new trees grow from the roots of an existing tree instead. It's like making an identical clone of yourself over and over and over again. Imagine if the whole country looked exactly like you. How confusing!

Sadly, when Dutch elm disease came to the UK in the 1970s, lots of English elms died, as every tree had the same weakness to the disease. If some of the trees had genetic resistance, then the disease would not have spread so quickly. This is why it's important to have genetic diversity within a species; differences make a population collectively stronger.




There is so much variety within the different kingdoms that not only can they be divided into categories, but these categories can then be further divided into many subcategories. For instance, an earthworm and a tiger are both in the animal kingdom but they are very different! Tigers belong to a subcategory called vertebrates – which includes all animals with back bones – while earthworms are invertebrates animals without back bones. This practice of splitting organisms into smaller and more specific groups continues further. For example, vertebrates are split into mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians and fish.







