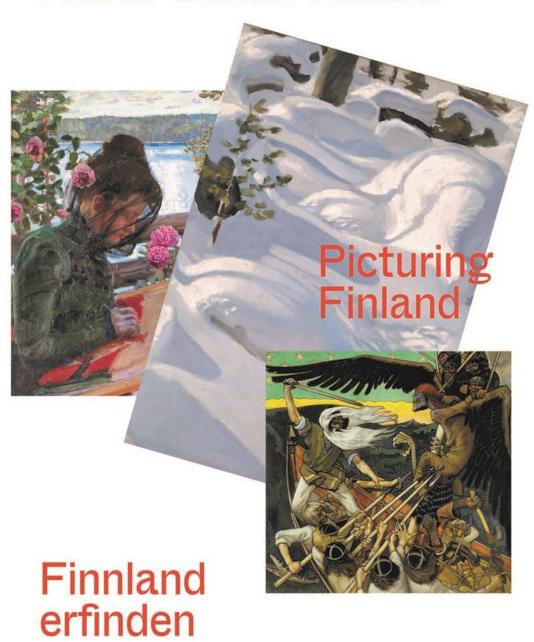

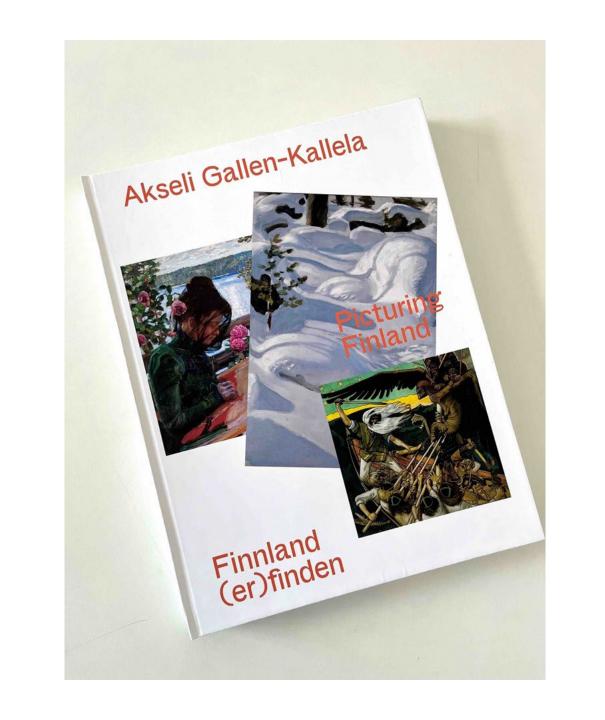

Lemminkäinens Mutter

Lemminkäinen ist neben dem alten Weisen Väinämöinen und dem Schmied Ilmarinen ein Protagonist des Kalevala. Der junge Held ist ein Heißsporn, der einen mystischen Schwan im Fluss um das Totenreich zu töten versucht. Dabei wird Lemminkäinen in zahllose Stücke gerissen, doch seine ihn liebende Mutter eilt zu seiner Rettung herbei und fügt die Stücke wieder zusammen. Das Gemälde zeigt Lemminkäinens ausgestreckten Leichnam am Ufer eines schwarzen Gewässers. Seine Mutter, für die die Mutter des Künstlers Modell saß, hockt neben ihm, die Hand auf seine fahle Brust gelegt, den Blick verzweifelt zum Himmel erhoben. Über ihrem Kopf und der düsteren Osiris- und des Orpheus-Mythos. Das Szenerie erscheint ein schimmernder Lichtstrahl. Ein Wunder wird bald geschehen: Eine Biene fliegt auf sie zu und

bringt den göttlichen Lebensbalsam, der den Helden wiedererwecken wird.

Die emotionsgeladene Darstellung ist vielleicht die vielschichtigste und rätselhafteste von Gallen-Kallelas visuellen Auseinandersetzungen mit der mythischen Welt des Kalevala. Der stilistische und thematische Eklektizismus verdeutlicht die intensive spirituelle Suche, auf der sich der Künstler zur Entstehungszeit des Gemäldes befand. Das mythische Thema manifestiert sich visuell in einem synthetistischen Stil mit kräftigen Konturen und flachen Farbfeldern. Die Komposition ähnelt einer Pietà, der Darstellung der Jungfrau Maria mit dem Leichnam Jesu auf dem Schoß, diese religiöse Konnotation ist allerdings mit anderen mythologischen Motiven verflochten, Als Geschichte eines Helden, der den Tod zu überwinden vermag, enthält die Lemminkäinen-Sage auch Elemente des zentrale Thema der Mutterliebe verbindet sich demnach mit dem Motiv von Tod und Auferstehung, ML

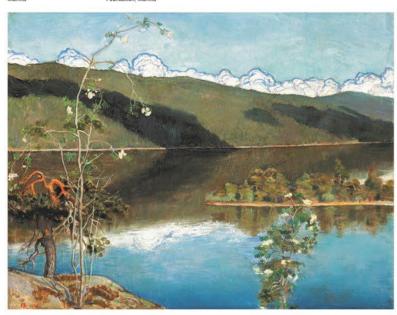
Lemminkäinen's Mother

Lemminkäinen is one of the main characters in the Kalevala, along with Väinämöinen, an old sage, and Ilmarinen, a blacksmith. He is a hot-tempered young man who attempts to kill the swan that lives in the river of death. In the process, Lemminkäinen's body is torn into bits and pieces, but his loving mother comes to the rescue and reassembles the pieces. The painting shows Lemminkäinen's dead body stretched out on the shore of a wblack river. His mother, modeled after the artist's own mother, sits beside him with her palm on his pale chest, gazing toward the heavens in desperation. Above the gloomy landscape, shimmering rays of light appear over her head. A miracle is about to happen: a little bee is flying toward them, carrying the divine balm of life that will bring the hero back to life.

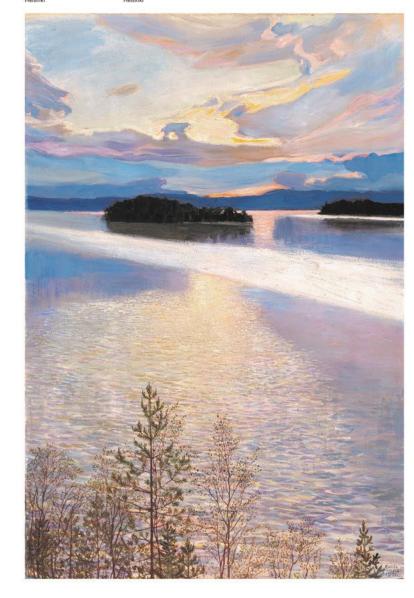
This emotionally charged painting is perhaps the most multilayered and enigmatic among Gallen-Kallela's visual renditions of the mythical world of the Kalevala. Its stylistic and thematic eclecticism is illustrative of the intense spiritual search that the artist was engaged in at the time of the painting's creation. The mythical subject finds a visual manifestation in the Synthetist style with strong contours and flat fields of color. The composition resembles a Christian pietà, a motif depicting the Virgin Mary cradling the dead body of Jesus, but this thematic layer is intertwined with other mythical dimensions. As a hero who can overcome death, Lemminkäinen's tale contains elements of the legends of both Osiris and Orpheus. The central subject of maternal love thus becomes entangled with notions of death and resurrection, ML

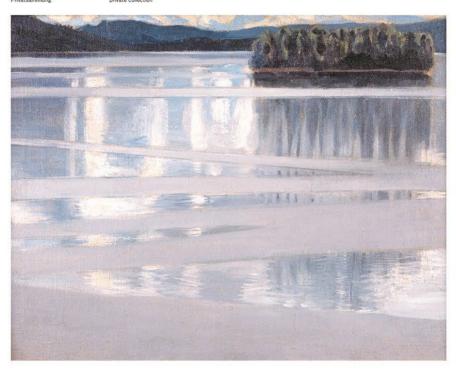
Lake Keitele

This view of Lake Keitele in central Finland is atmospheric, modern, and typically Finnish-the perfect synthesis of Gallen-Kallela's creativity. The close Finnish natural environment in this pure landscape is reflected in the gray zigzag Vier Versionen dieser Komposition sind pattern, the artist's interpretation of "Väinämöinen's wake." The reference to the ancient bard, an important character in the epic, gives the picture a mythical dimension.

Four versions of this motif are known. They are all similar, emphasizing the importance of this composition for the artist. He painted these pictures during a period of artistic reorientation. In his search for the right balance between realism and painterly abstraction, he drew on the experience of his experiments with but was also inspired by contemporary international tendencies. Klimt's On Lake Attersee, which Gallen-Kallela had seen at have been a direct source of inspiration. In both pictures, the bold view makes the tightly structured surface of the lake into the protagonist of the composition. Nothing stands between the viewer and the water. Klimt and Gallen-Kallela conjure up the characteristic features of the landscape on the canvas deliberately with minimal means that border on the abstract. AGS

Tapestry Bamboo Bubble 2023, ø 180 cm S. / p. 57: Detail

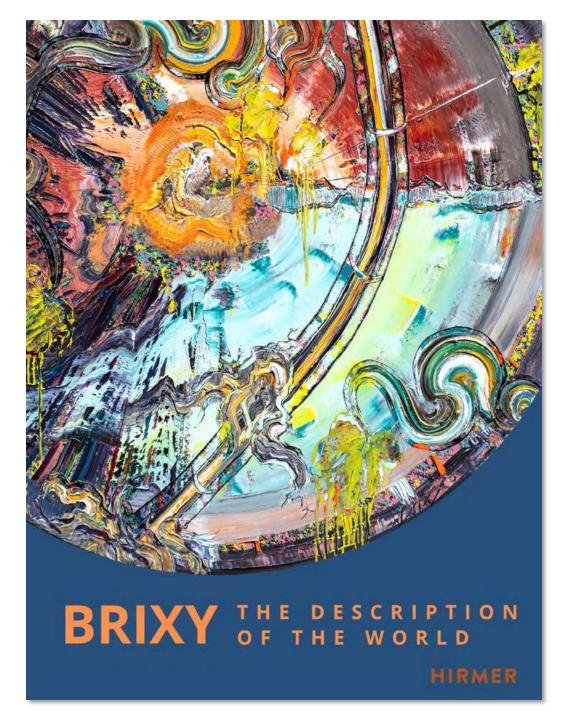

Angela Thomas, art historian and Max Bill's widow, offers intimate insight into the peak years of his career.

- Max Bill was a Swiss architect, painter, sculptor, and typeface and product designer. Educated and influenced by the Bauhaus, Bill was a founder of the Concrete Art movement. His iconic kitchen and table clocks, and wristwatches (designed for Junghans) are regarded as ultimate design classics. He strived for constructive clarity and precise proportions in his designs, all of which had to be suitable for everyday use.

It is a massive 800-page paperback with illustrations throughout and provides an intimate and anecdotal account of Bill's life at the height of his career during WWII and the postwar era.

Andreas Gerwig, a Social Democrat from Basel and a member of the National Council from 1967 to 1983—where he, Helmut Hubacher, Walter Renschler, and Lilian Uchtenhagen became the influential "Band of Four"—once commented that Bill "did politics in pictures," that is to say, he would often use visual examples. That did not go down well with most of his political colleagues. But Andreas Gerwig, for his part, had been "absolutely electrified, galvanized" by Bill's speeches in parliament.¹⁵⁷

In addition to presenting his own political views "in pictures," when Bill was sitting in long meetings he found that new ideas for pictorial compositions would come to him, which he would swiftly sketch on National Council paper or documents.

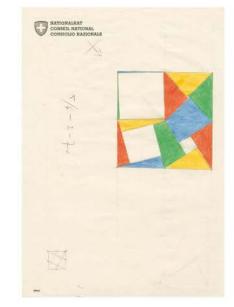
The cabaret artist Alfred Rasser—like Max Bill—was also not always taken seriously in parliament—despite the fact that he was the first member of the National Council to raise the extremely urgent question as to what was to be done with the nuclear waste that was being produced in Swiss nuclear plants.¹⁵⁸

An obituary for Andreas Gerwig in 2014 notes that he "had a major influence on the politics of the Social Democratic Party" and that, in his capacity as a lawyer, "he fought against the Kaiseraugst nuclear power plant." 159

One point that is brushed over in the obituary for Andreas Gerwig was his work "as a lobbyist paid by the cigarette industry." In a private conversation in Zurich in 2019, Erich Schmid and I heard this from another Social Democrat, the lawyer and cultural connoisseur Franz Schumacher. That information was rather disillusioning. The sheer extent of lobbying at the parliament in Bern and the lack of transparency

single work by Bill: "Dear Max Bill When I had finished work on the manuscript for the catalogue of the Emanuel Hoffmann collection, I found it unbearable that your name was missing from it. So on the spur of the moment, I added my painting.... On another note, a beautiful brass sculpture by you, lent by the Arp-Täuber collection, is on display at the museum.... Yours, Keeper."47

The painting Schmidt refers to as "his painting" is Max Bill's oil painting on canvas betonungen aus dem gelben (1946), which became part of the Collection of the Emanuel Hoffmann Foundation at Kunstmuseum Basel in 1953, as a "gift from Dr. Georg Schmidt" (inv. no. H 1953.11).⁴⁸ The brass sculpture Schmidt mentions is presumably konstruktion in und mit kubus (1944–45), which Hans Arp gifted to Kunstmuseum Basel in 1966.

"Dear Georg.... I've always regarded you as an idealist who would not hesitate to give his own possessions away. But it was never my intention, via you, to spare the Emanuel Hoffmann Foundation a decision, and to be honest I would have been happier not to be represented in the foundation in these circumstances."

Following secretarial convention, the typed signature "b/p" at the end of Bill's letter indicates the initial of the author followed by that of the typist—here his secretary is Corinne Pulver.

Collaboration Will Be Possible

In his essay "The Mastery of Space" Max Bill wrote, "in the near future, collaboration will be possible between functionalist architects, engineers, and constructors of space." His comments suggest that he had most probably already read the *Realistic Manifesto* (1920) published by Antoine Pevsner and his younger brother, Naum Gabo.

In their *Realistic Manifesto*—not to be confused with Realism in art—Pevsner and Gabo describe their approach to sculpture: "The plumb-line in our hand, eyes as precise as a ruler, in a spirit as taut

which Scherchen would conduct in August 1941 in Winterthur in the orchestral version by Roger Vuataz. 453

In the left margin of the invitation card there are a few bars of music, written in pencil. Above it, in Bill's hand, are the words "[illegible] rhytmus [sic]" and in the middle of the card "atem [breath]/herz [heart] 1:4 18:72."

Joachim Lucchesi has identified the music as "the main subject in Bach's *Die Kunst der Fuge*, most probably jotted down by Scherchen." 454 Max Bill could read music: he had learned the cello as a boy and had played banjo in the Bauhaus band as a student.

As for the breath to heart ratios, Lucchesi has suggested Scherchen may have discussed these "in his lecture on musical interpretation, because he gave a great deal of thought to these bodily functions in relation to musical meters, rhythms, and the speeds chosen by performers. It was a favorite topic of his."455

Rhythms, Sounds, Vibrations

"My experience at the Bauhaus and meetings with older colleagues in Paris taught me that I had to find some other, new path. That neither the Bauhaus path nor the influences from Paris could be my yardstick. I had to find a way out somewhere else."

Bill's experience at the Bauhaus was shaped by his masters: Josef Albers, László Moholy-Nagy, Paul Klee, Wassily Kandinsky, and Oskar Schlemmer; the influences from Paris came from members of Abstraction-Création, which Bill joined in December 1933; the group's members included artists such as Hans Arp, Sophie Taeuber-Arp, Piet Mondrian, Sonia Delaunay, Antoine Pevsner, César Domela, Jean Gorin, Marlow Moss, and Georges Vantongerloo.

"So I went back to basic principles and I asked myself ... what does music actually consist of? It consists of rhythms, it consists of sounds, vibrations, combinations. The vibrations and the sounds are combined by rhythms, by mathematical intervals, by methods that allow

Carola Giedion-Welcker's Obituary for Mondrian

Carola Giedion-Welcker's obituary for Mondrian was published in *Werk* in April 1944: "Mondrian's art is deliberately 'impoverished.' ... He strove for unblemished truthfulness that would prompt painting to reflect on its moral vocation and to fully utilize its own unique means of expression.... He had to weather hard times with the 'unsellable rectangles' that people shrugged their shoulders at and that left him starving."936 The same issue of *Werk* also contains an article by Bill marking twenty-five years since the founding of the Bauhaus in Weimar, on 1 April 1919 (x, xiii).

Two years before Carola Giedion-Welcker composed her obituary for Piet Mondrian, Max Bill had written a text to mark Mondrian's seventieth birthday, which was published in Dutch: "Aan Piet Mondriaan op zijn 70en Verjaardag," De 8 en OPBOUW 13, no. 12 (December 1942): 154).

Solely Responsible

In 1943 the Basler Kunstverein invited Max Bill to curate the first comprehensive exhibition of Concrete art to be presented at Kunsthalle Basel. It would prove to be much wider ranging than the prewar *Konstruktivisten* curated by Georg Schmidt in 1937.

As the records show, in December 1943 Bill took sole charge of the preparations for the exhibition. In a letter to the artists Hans Arp and Walter Bodmer, Lucas Lichtenhan (the director of the Kunsthalle) confirmed that Bill was not only selecting the works, he was also arranging their transportation. 937

In late February 1944 Bill contacted Lichtenhan to inquire whether the Basler Kunstverein imagined he were doing "everything on a purely voluntary basis" or whether there was "a hidden treasure" lying in wait for him. "Of course this question does not impinge on my work, on the time I devote to it or its quality, yet I do have to live from my work, like any other mortal, and would therefore like to know if that is in fact possible. If you

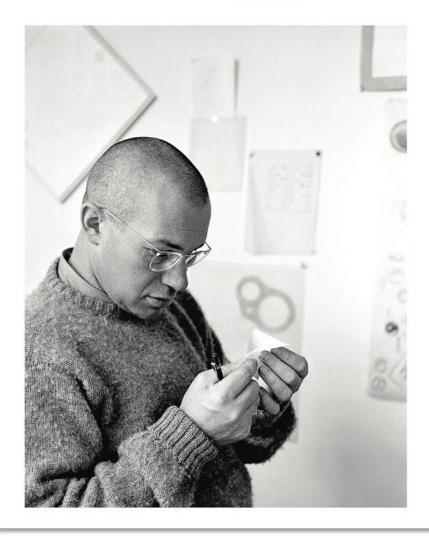

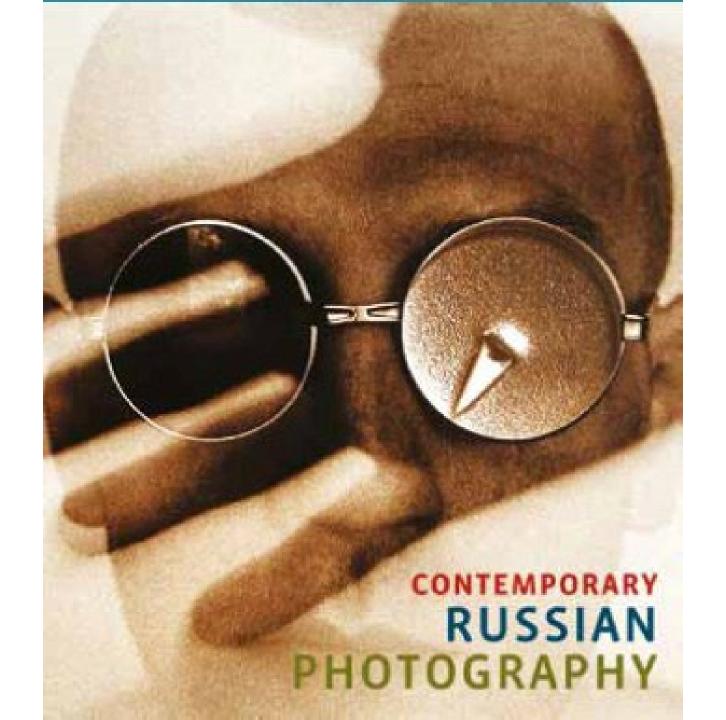

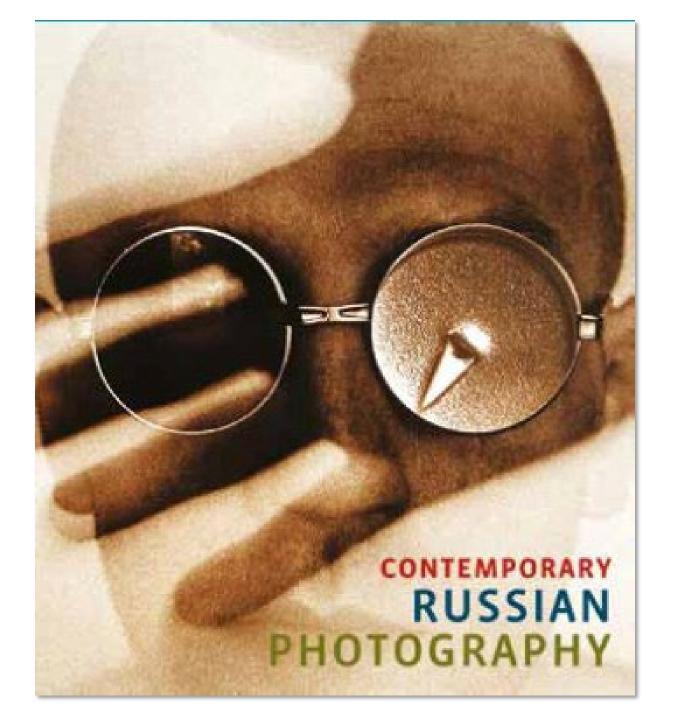

Angela Thomas, art historian and Max Bill's widow, offers intimate insight into the peak years of his career.

- Max Bill was a Swiss architect, painter, sculptor, and typeface and product designer. Educated and influenced by the Bauhaus, Bill was a founder of the Concrete Art movement. His iconic kitchen and table clocks, and wristwatches (designed for Junghans) are regarded as ultimate design classics. He strived for constructive clarity and precise proportions in his designs, all of which had to be suitable for everyday use.
- The second of (possibly) a three-volume biography of Max Bill's life and artistic career, written by his widow. It is a massive 800-page paperback with illustrations throughout and provides an intimate and anecdotal account of Bill's life at the height of his career during WWII and the postwar era.

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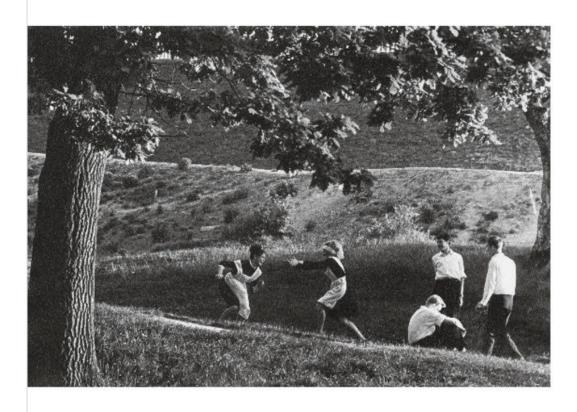


Contemporary Russian Photography

During the pandemic years, Elliot Ross captured images of crows taking to the air from the roofs surrounding his apartment on Russian Hill in San Francisco, California. It became a contemplative piece of art about one of the most inteligent bird species in existence.

Crows Ascending is dedicated to the memory of Elliot's younger brother Michael. Michael had a profound intellectual disability caused by lifelong epilepsy. He survived a severe case of Covid-19 in 2020 only to die of Parkinson's-related pneumonia months later. It is also dedicated to the millions of others who have suffered or died in the United States - many due to government inaction - from Covid-19.

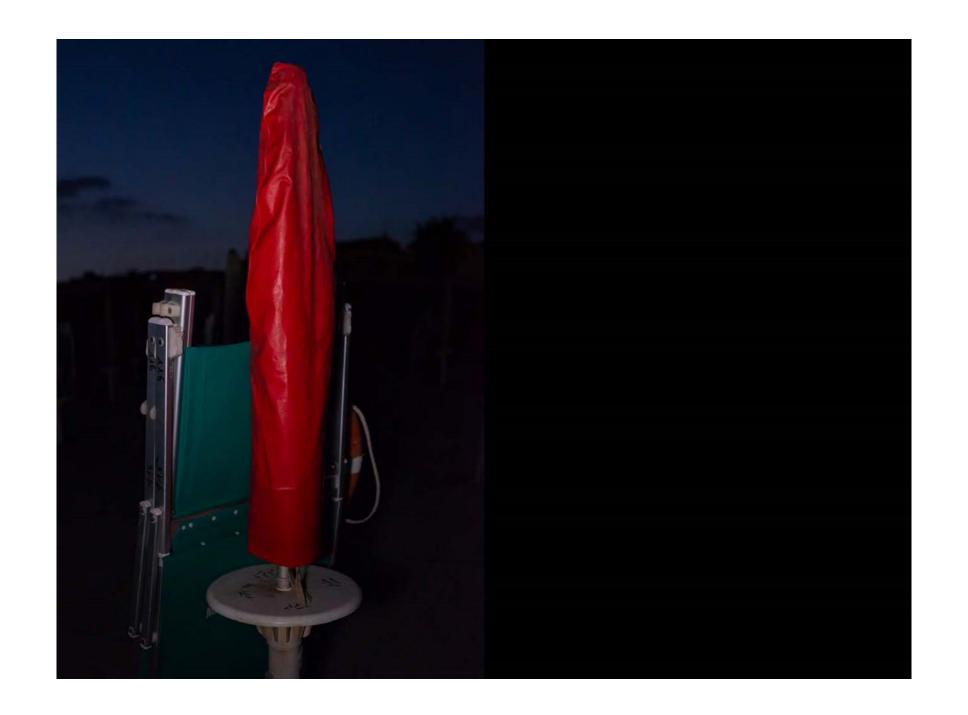
This enchanting book looks at the fruitful opportunities of new interpersonal relationships after a two-year compulsory break. Rome, artistic and monumental, is the setting. The background is lively yet anonymous: empty spaces spared from ubiquitous tourism. It was here that Mar Sáez decided to observe the reappearing residents, and above all the yearning young lovers, on the beaches of Rome's Ostia seaside resort.

Inside the workshop of the museum, a performer forges sculptures out of PCB and solder. Visitors can follow this process through a livestream. Once the object is finished, the performer leaves the workshop with the sculpture. He crosses the borders from private to public, from virtual reality to physical presence, and meets with the public at the space where he has been watched. He asks the audience for personal objects or tokens to place inside the sculptures. A communal chronicle of events slowly becomes evident as the work is then installed inside the museum space.





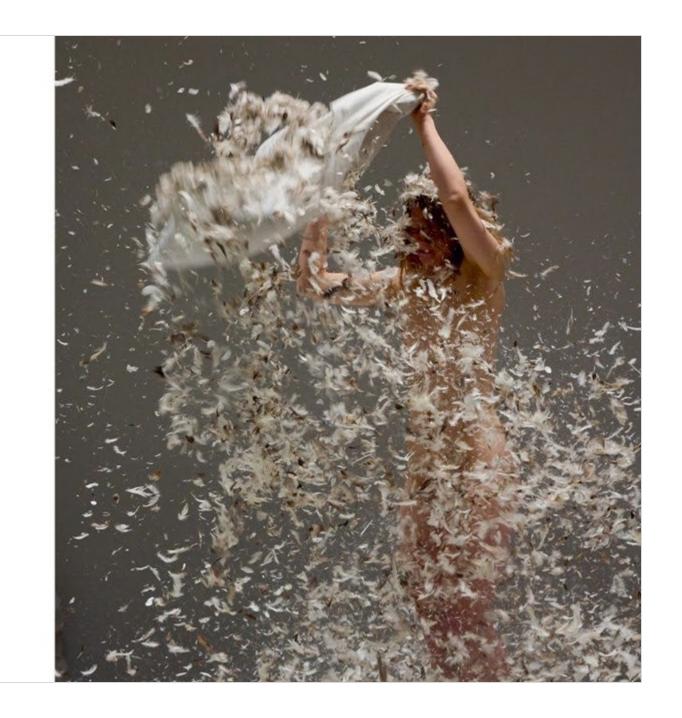


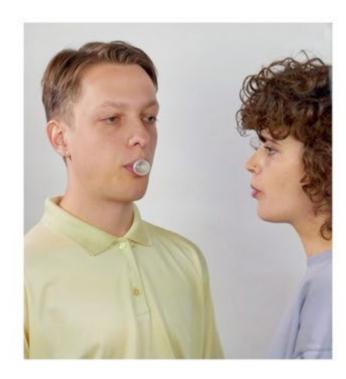

a day for seven weeks and her performance becomes in the end a collective experience where the public takes part, counting with her; Portroit of the Unknown Man by Yannis Adoniou and Stavros Apostolatos; Corner Time by Despina Zacharopoulou. And finally: O vinculo by Mauricio Lanès, who now teaches performance in Vienna, where he de-spectacularizes the performance by simply creating, an open space in which he just spends time, talks with the public, if anybody comes in, and explains that they can do whatever they want with the space and his body. In that space everything is done by the public, It's a liberatory space. One could observe different dynamics like destruction vs. development. An exercise in social responsibility.

After viewing the videos I go bome with Gaia, eat some fruit and muesli and go back to the SANAA. I spend a wonderful and productive evening there completely alone on the first floor of the empty, silent, and illuminated building. I record the piece "Glacier" for bass flute by Dai Fnjikura for a university presentation. It is a pleasure to be alone and creative in such a huge space, a temple of modern architecture. At 9 p.m. Belendj comes to pick me up, we go to the flat. I cook something for us all (also for Gaia and Lukas) and then go to sleep.

1.2.2023

I wake up again very early and enjoy coffee, kitchen, and so on alone. I answer e-mails and prepare the last documents for my flat. Then we have breakfast all together and I go to the SANAA with Bel and Gaia. Today there is no warm-up because Marina and Billy need to give us all feedback. I sit at my office/working-place in the middle of the first floor and cut the crystals-presentation video. Then Marina and Billy come to me for the feedback: we discuss the news about my performance Tabula rasa. Diary pieces, the steps to go through in this phase, the translation program, the little stage to sit on, an intimate space in the museum (maybe in a corner?), my outfit (black, simple: come as you are now says Marina), etc. Marina says that I look very good and happy and asks me if I'm in love. I'm happy indeed even though confused and also emotionally überfordert. But I let myself be happily carried by the flow of things. Then I work and research stuff for the performance, write down notes.

For lunch Gaia, Smila, and I go back to the flat and cook pasta. We have a really nice chat. Afternoon at the SANAA. Again, research and desk work. At 5 p.m. videos and a kind of lecture by Marina in the auditorium. She shows us documentation material from her work House with the Ocean View. First a suggestion about the title:

think big, transcend the concept. In this case the audience is the ocean. She spent twelve days on three platforms in a gallery in New York. She didn't eat, drank only water. It was a process of purification that also affected the public, with whom she was intimately connected: they could use a telescope and see any detail of her body and routine and could also go closer to her. Toweling herself after the shower was her only moment of privacy. Everyday she dressed in a different color according to Indian symbology and used the same shoes she had to do the walk on the Chinese Wall. To force herself to be in the here and now she stood in front of the ladders that had blades instead of rungs. In those twelve days she developed a routine and experience, which are the grounding stones for long durational performances. In such works you can transcend simple activities into miracles.

For this performance she chose to have a written documentation in the catalog: a report of every single action she did on the platform that could give more of the sense of time passing than a twelve-day-long video.

Those days were for Marina holy, she developed a super-self, things happened, everything was part of the performance. Her focus, her energy came from the audience. But too much energy is also dangerous and can destroy. Performance is a transcendental form of art. It changes records.

Then Marina and Billy show us some historical material: Das Triadische Ballet by Oskar Schlemmer, a Bauhaus ballet; fashion show by Comme des Garçons and by Harri for the London Fashion Week; Joseph Beinys's I like America and America likes Me; Austin Powers's Dr. Evil; Ana Prvaéki's Nourishing Façade, where she licks the copper façade of a building and other works by her: Mask, Money Loundering Wet Wipes, Hand Pollination Gloee (very short video, advertising like).

After the videos I stay a little bit longer in the SANAA and organize some final things (material and so on), then leave, shop at ReWe, go with Smila to Vierhofer Platz to see Lakas's exhibition and then reach the others at Nord Café, where Belendj also joins us. We then drive home together.

2.2.202;

I wake up at 8 a.m. Way to SANAA with Gaia. I sit at my desk on the first floor, organize the translation program with Jan, Leon's boyfriend, and the shooting of some videos (new head pieces for my final bachelor concert Ceystals). In the lunch break I go shopping in Essen City, I buy items I need for the videos with Gaia, Fred, and me.

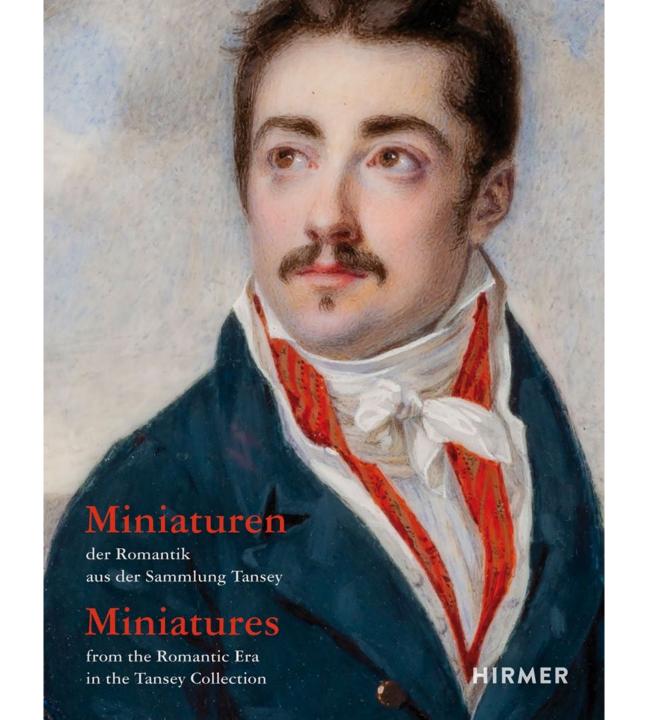

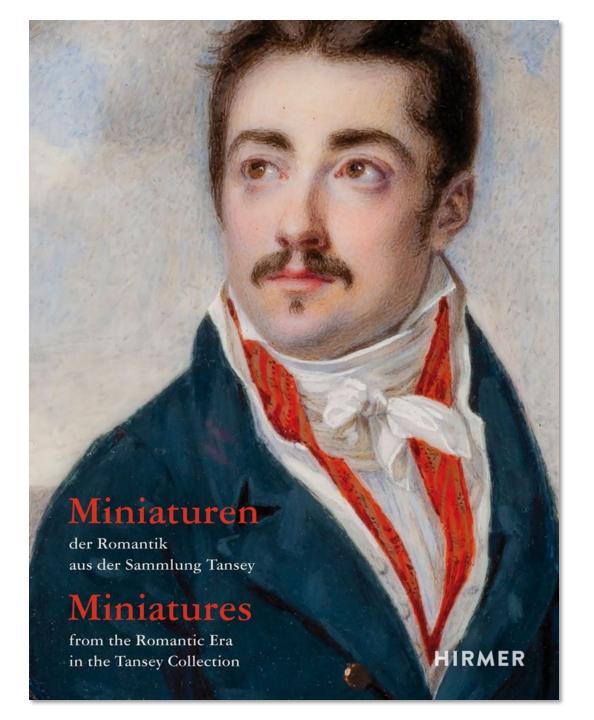

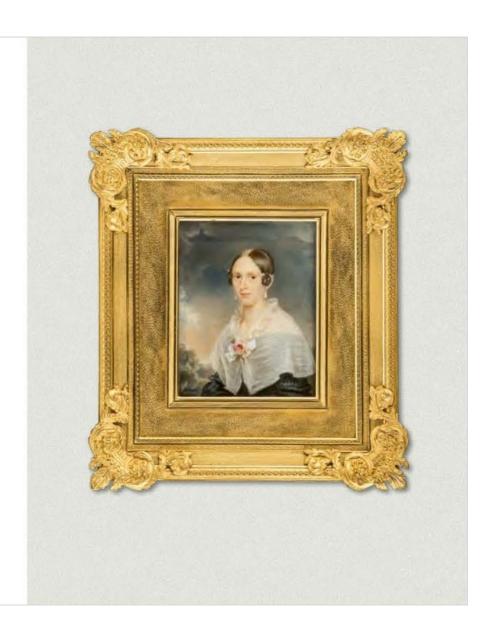

Am eiter portrayed this unknown middle-aged lady in front of a cloudy background which opens up towards the centre, thus drawing attention to the head and bust of the sitter. The sitter's straight dark brown hair is worn in a plain style with a middle parting. The ends are tightly plaited and coiled into mails that are pinned in front of the ears. Pearl earrings, pearls worked subtly into the harstyle, and a single rose pinned to the front of the shawl serve as the sitter's only adornments. The plain appearance of the model and the black dress lead to the assumption that the portrait depicts a widow! While Ameiter's talent is frequently evident in the perfect rendering of the decorative details of his usually sump to ously dressed and coiffed models, this portrait reveals his ability to create a delicate depiction of the face. He created the skin tones using several glazed layers of paint and visible brushstrokes. The gradual transitions between different shades of skin colour, and delicate blueish shadows give the face a contoured yet s oft appearance.

Der mit 39 Jahren jung verstobene Auguste Simon Gamerey machte als Maler von Ministurporträts eine erstannliche Karnere und häuffe ein beachtliches Vermögen an. Kürstlenisch gilt er als einer der treuesten Nachfolger seines Lehrer; Jean-Beptiste Isaber, Wie dieser malte auch er die meisten seiner Porträts in Aquarell suf Papier. Eine besondere Vorliebe hatte er für mit Blumen und Schleiern geschmückte Damenbildnisse, die er manchmal – eine Spezialität von ihm –in einer Jahnerden Blumengirlande darstellte.

Das vorliegende Porträt erhält durch verschiedene Accessoires einen zurten, sehr femirinen Charakter. Es zeigt eine junge Frau in einem dünnen, spittenbesetten Kleid mit hochgeschlossenem Spittenkragen und eigenwillig drapiertem karierten Halstuch. Ihr Haar ist sorgfältig in Locken gelegt und mit gelben Blumen geschmückt. Aus großen Mardelaugen blickt sie den Bildbetrachter – damals den Adressaten des Porträts – sehneüchtig an. Für ihn hat sie sich annutig geldeidet und geschmückt, ihm will sie gefällen. Das Porträt zählt zu Gamereys besonders gelungenen Werken, es stahlt untz der Weichheit der Kontraste und der stißlichen Farbtöne eine ansprechende Ernsthaftigkeit aus.

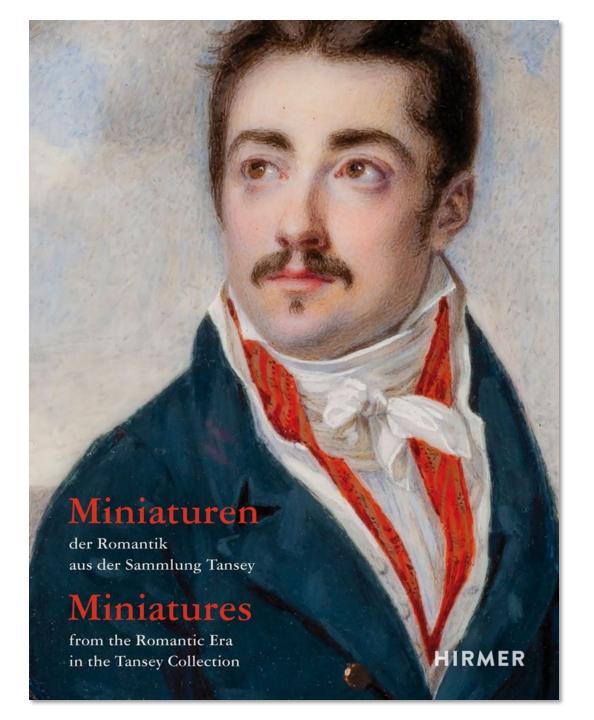

The artist Auguste Sonon Garnerey, who died at the young age of 39, had an astounding career as a miniaturist and amassed an impressive for two. In art or cles, he is considered one of the most faithful students of fear-Baptiste Isabey. Her labey Garnerey painted most of his porticits in water colour on paper. He had a special perchant for por hats of women decorated with flowers and valls. Sometimes he presented them framed by a garkend of flowers; in fact, this was one of his specialities.

The use of various accessories in the present portrait affords it a delicate and very feminine character. It shows a young woman in a thin lace-timmed dress with a high lace collar and an unconventionally draped checked scarf. Her hair has been carefully use led and adorned with yellow flowers. She looks longingly at the viewer, the erstwhile recipient of the portrait, with large abrond-shaped eyes. She wants to please him and has chosen her clothing and levellery carefully. The portrait is one of Garnerey's most successful works: despite the softness of the contrasts and the tender colour tones, it radiates an appealing estousness.
