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# Along the River

Herring gull

In this book we follow Mouse as he journeys by river from his woodland home to the sea. Here are some of the things that you can find in the pages of this book. You can also look out for them the next time you are by a river.



### The River

Rainwater, springs and streams join together to form a river. As the river journeys to the sea it is constantly changing, shaped by the landscape it flows through. Each section of the river is home to lots of different animals and plants, so a walk along a riverbank is always full of surprises.



### Fish

Rivers are home to a huge range of fish, from tiny minnows to the mighty pike. The type of fish you can find depends on the type of river. Some fish, like trout, need fast-flowing water and a gravelly riverbed. Others, like the roach, will be found where the river is slow.





## River Dipping

Why not have a go at river dipping? Find a shallow section of river with a stony bottom. Make sure to take care and always have an adult with you for safety! Scoop a net or sieve along the riverbed, against the flow of the water. Empty it into a container to see what you have found. Remember to be gentle with wildlife, and return everything to its river home after you've had a look.

#### Plants

Look out for the bright flowers of the yellow flag iris, the long seedheads of reedmace, and the huge leaves of butterbur. Below the surface of a slow-flowing river you might spot pondweed and hornwort. The yellow waterlily sends up its leaves and flowers to float on the river's surface. Mosses, liverworts and ferns carpet riverbanks in many shades of green.

#### Estuaries

An estuary is where the river meets the sea. Here the fresh water of the river mixes with the salty water of the sea. The water level rises and falls with the tide. Look out for the bright orange beak of the oystercatcher, the outstretched wings of the cormorant, and gulls flying overhead.

On a warm sunny day, you might see dragonflies and damselflies. These beautifully coloured insects hover in the air before darting off in search of food. In slow-moving rivers, look out for whirligig beetles and water boatmen moving across the surface of the water.

## Reedbeds

Reedbeds can be found along the edges of some rivers and estuaries. Reeds can grow up to two metres high to form thick, watery forests. Reedbeds are home to some very secretive birds. Bitterns move silently through the reeds but in spring their deep booming call can be heard up to a mile away. Reed warblers weave beautiful, cup-shaped nests, which hang between the reeds.

#### Mammals

Many animals will visit rivers to drink and look for food, but some actually live by the water. Otters are excellent swimmers. They can be very hard to spot but look out for their five-toed footprints in the mud. Beavers help shape our rivers by building dams. Water voles are often mistaken for rats, but voles have shorter, rounded noses and furry tails. Look out for their burrows in the banks of slow-moving rivers.

## Birds

Mallard ducks, moorhens and coots are a common sight on rivers. Kingfishers are harder to spot, sitting quietly on a branch or diving with a sudden flash of blue. The heron is a large bird that waits patiently in the shallows for its next meal to swim by. Lots of small birds can be found too. Look out for the bobbing pied wagtail or the black cap of the willow tit.



## Trees

Trees provide shelter for riverside animals and shade that keeps the water cool. Their strong roots help to hold riverbanks together. Trees such as alder, willow and birch like to grow in damp soil. Willow trees grow very fast and can be cut regularly so fresh stems grow from their trunk. This is called pollarding. The cut branches can be used for weaving and fencing.
















## ANCIENT WRITING

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
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
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## **Cookies and Crescents**

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
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
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# **Every Peach Is a Story**

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
# The Shape of Time (Rymworld Arcana, Book 1)



"Isn't number eleven gallbladder?"


"Gallbladder's seven, Lord Lamberto. Look for yourself."

"Lots and lots."


"How many, would you say, more or less?"

"Of course. Otherwise, how could I have understood them when they told me that no one could get off the boat and that I had to head back to shore? They spoke Italian."





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
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
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
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
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
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


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
