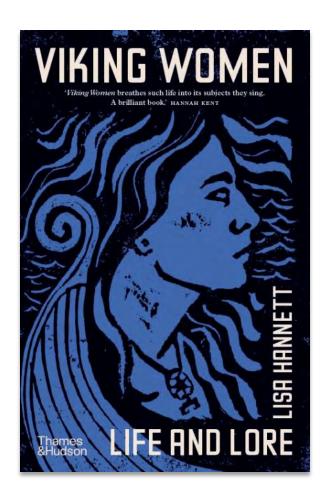

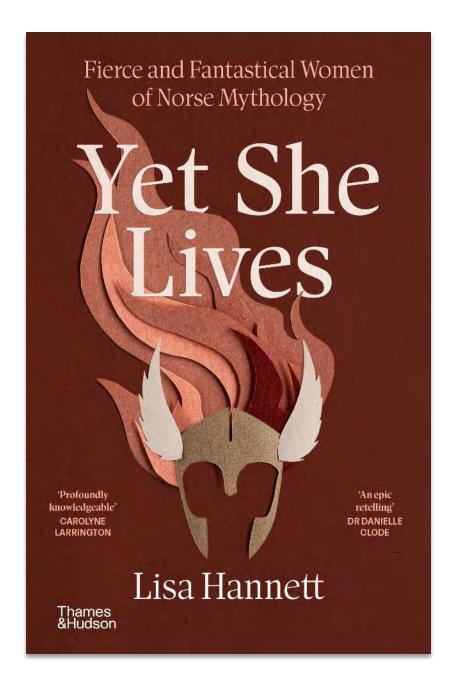

#### Cast of Characters

Many people nowadays have at least a passing familiarity with the most prominent figures and features of Norse mythology, but not all of the characters in this book are as well known as gods such as Odin, Thor or Loki. Bearing this in mind, I've compiled a list of relevant primary and secondary characters here for ease of reference.

Some Old Norse-Icelandic words and nicknames appear in italics; otherwise, for the most part I have anglicised names in this book (omitting Icelandic letters, accents and nominative 'r' endings). However, I have opted to keep the 'd' in Angrboda and Skaði's names – which is pronounced like the 'th' in 'Beth' – because they roll off the tongue more smoothly this way. The protagonists of each chapter are emphasised in **bold** below.

- Angrboða: a jötunn (giantess); Loki's lover; mother of Fenrir, Jormungand and Hel
- Aslaug: a shieldmaiden; daughter of legendary Brynhild and Sigurd; wife of legendary Ragnar lobbrok ('Hairy-breeches'); mother of Ivar binn beinlausi ('the Boneless'), Hvitserk, Ubbe and Sigurd ormr-i-auga ('Snake-in-the-eye')
- · Æsir and Ásynjur: the male and female top-tier gods
- Baldur: bright and beautiful son of Odin and Frigg; favoured among the gods
- Egil Skallagrimsson: Viking Age Icelandic warrior-poet;
   Gunnhild's nemesis

## Ár var alda ... (In ancient times ...)

There are no words in the beginning. Everything is quiet, the darkness absolute. There's no sand, no sea, no cooling waves in this vast, empty space; only a deeper, darker chasm yawning in the starless black. Ginnungagap, they'll call it one day, once language is invented and mouths shaped to speak it. The gaping void. This abyss exhales with a damp guttural hhhaaahhhhhhhh, like someone fogging a window with their breath, ready to draw a picture with their fingertips.

There is no time here.

No straightforward plot sequence to creation.

There is nothing but Ginnungagap.

Except ... (bear with me on this) ... Niftheim also exists. See that hazy place over in the northern-ish distance, shrouded in freezing mists? Its borders are blurry, its size hard to gauge in the fog, but eleven powerful rivers spurt from a single source in its midst, and their cold waters are already thrumming, fast roiling this way ...

Now look left, across the ravine of Ginnungagap. Compass bearings are meaningless out here in the aether, so let's just pretend that way is south. *Look*, but don't go any closer. See that warm, amber

#### CHAPTER 3

### Hel: Monstrous Child

Hel is miserable. Her hall, as always, is at capacity, but that doesn't stem the flow of the dead streaming in through the arched entranceway. Swollen-bellied mothers with too much blood streaking their shifts. Frost-rimed families tinged with winter freeze. Heartbroken lovers with rope-burnt necks, slashed wrists, poison-blacked lips. Sea-soaked sailors. Sun-leathered farmers wizened by too many bad harvests. Rich women swathed in silks and fine wools, clattering with brooches and bangles and beads. Thralls in rags. Witches. Weaponless, armourless men. Old folk shuffling with heads bowed and backs bent. Children with broken necks, crushed skulls, boil-blistered skin, rattling coughs, axed limbs, famine-gaunt bodies, throats bulged around life-taking obstructions. Babies.

So many quiet blue babies.

They're all welcome here. No matter how many minutes or days or decades they trod the world above, the overworn Hel-road that leads across Modgud's bridge always rises to meet them. Even now, hunched on the high-seat at the head of her fullest feasting table,

to be Valkyrie figures. Wearing floor-length garments and sporting long, knotted ponytails or elaborate braided updos, some of the women in these miniatures carry round shields and weapons (a sword or spear), either on horseback or standing at attention. Others show these martial women in profile, dressed in detailed robes, dresses or cloaks. A few of these figures keep their arms hidden, while this lovely example found in Öland, Sweden (c. 800–1000) quite clearly raises a cup.

Gotlandic picture stones dating from c. 400–1100, like the ones from Hunninge (GP0209) and Tjängvide (G 110, pictured page 171),<sup>47</sup> also depict presumably female figures in long garments, each holding a drinking horn aloft to 'welcome' male warriors (even Odin himself, astride Sleipnir, the eight-legged horse). Some scholars have argued that the cup-bearing Valkyrie is more than just a waitress-slash-male fantasy; they believe she's also a vital part of complex communal rituals to do with a person's transition from life

### Celery, radish, mint, broad beans, spring onion

This is what we want to eat every day in spring! Fresh, crunchy and colourful, with the broad beans reminding us of their short but sweet season.

#### Serves 4

400 g (14 oz) broad (fava) beans

% bunch of celery, out into 5 mm (¼ in) thick slices on the diagonal

5-6 radishes, cut into thin wedges

2 handfuls of mint leaves

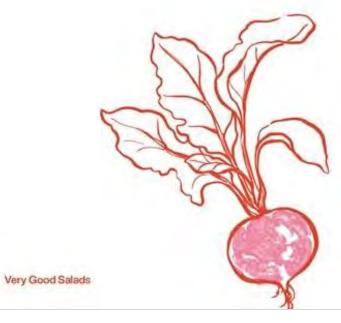
4 spring onions (scallions), thinly sliced

100 ml (3½ fl oz) extra virgin olive oil

juice of 1 lemon sea salt flakes O1 Pod the broad beans, then peel them again. This is easier if you give them a quick soak in hot water first.

O2 Place the double-podded beans, celery, radish, mint leaves and spring onion in a bowl. Drizzle over the olive oil and lemon juice, scatter with sea salt and toss gently to combine.

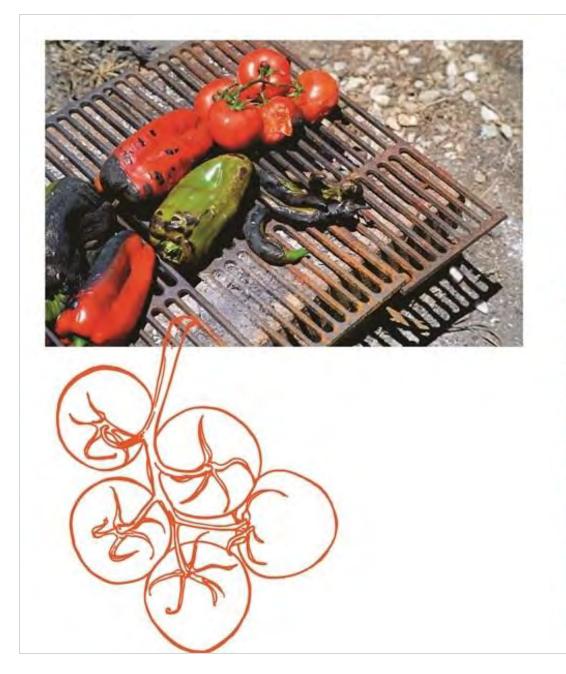

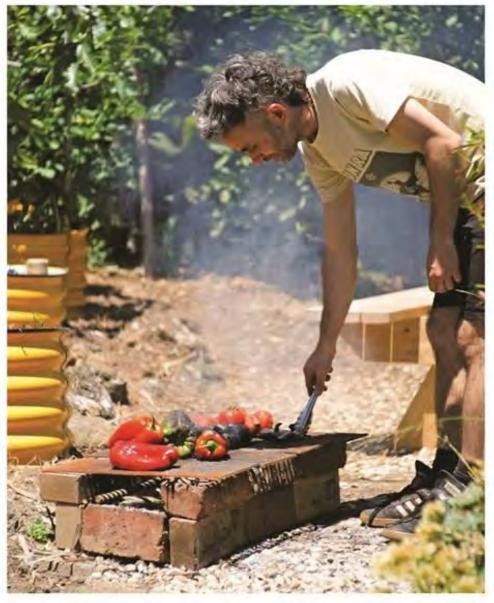

## Smoked grapes, pistachios, sumac, grains

Smoking grapes over an open fire or barbecue is a wonderful way to cook this super-sweet fruit. You can also roast them in the oven if you don't have access to a fire.

#### Serves 4

100 g (% cup) shelled pistachios

100 g (½ cup) cracked freekeh

1.5 kg (3 lb 5 oz) seedless red grapes, stems attached

handful of mint leaves, chopped

handful of parsley. chopped

1/2 red onion, finely diced

100 mi (3% fl oz) extra virgin alive all

juice of 1 lemon

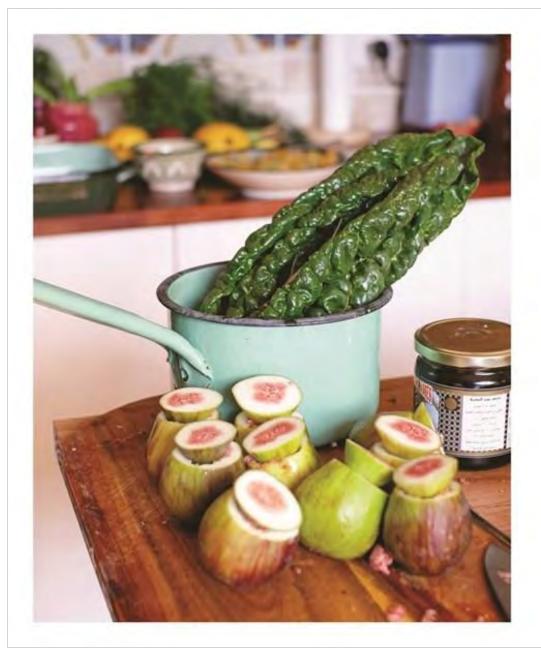
sea salt flakes and freshly ground black pepper

1 teaspoon ground sumac

- 01 Preheat the oven to 160°C (320°F) fan-forced.
- O2 Spread the pistachios over a baking tray and cook for 8-10 minutes, until fragrant, taking care not to overcook. Leave the pistachios to cool, then finely chop.
- O3 Bring a saucepen of salted water to the boil over high heat, add the freekeh, then reduce the heat to medium and boil for about 15 minutes or until tender. Drain and spread the freekeh out on a tray to cool and dry.
- O4 Wash the grapes and place them over a fire to smoke. You can do this by suspending them with string about 75 cm (2 ft 6 in) above a campfire or placing them on a charcoal grill. Over the fire, they will take about an hour to smoke; on a grill it will be much quicker, about 15 minutes. Alternatively, increase the oven temperature to 180°C (350°F) fan-forced and roast the grapes on a baking tray for 20 minutes or until they are slightly shrivelled. Allow the grapes to cool, then remove the stems.
- 05 Mix the grapes, freekeh, herbs and onion in a large bowl. Dress with the olive oil and lemon juice and season to taste with salt and pepper. Transfer to a serving dish, sprinkle with the sumac and pistachios and serve.

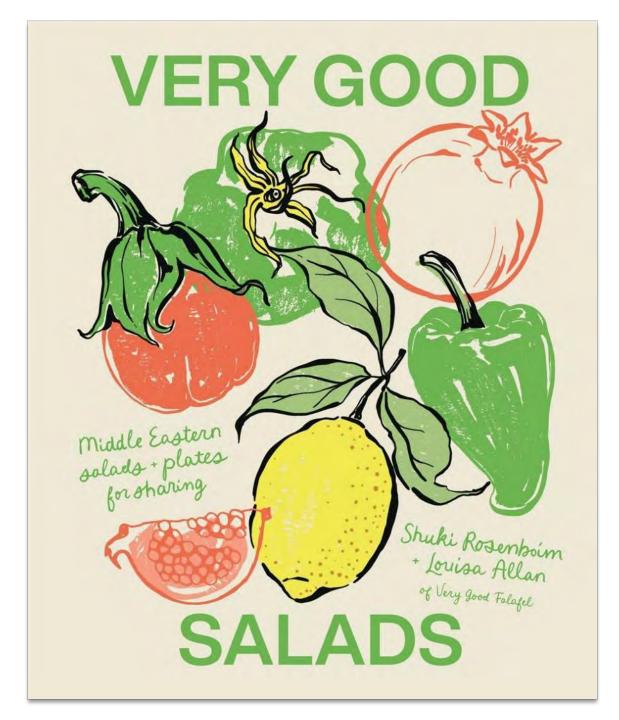

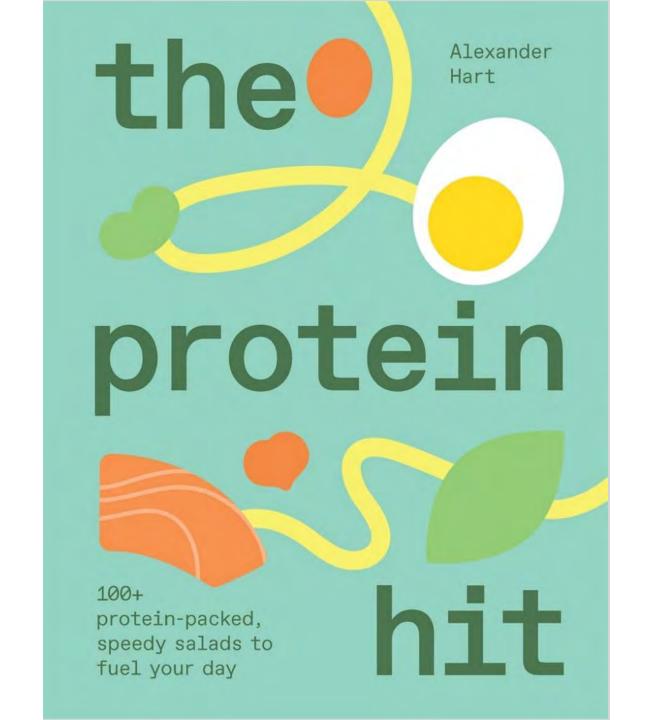

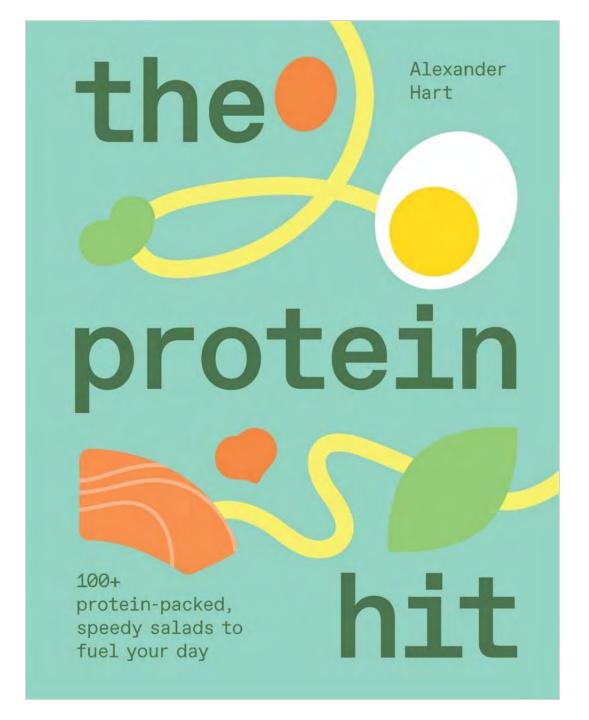

#### CHICKE

Lean, tasty and endlessly adaptable – chicken is perfect for slicing into strips, shredding, and tossing through noodles and grains. If you're short on time, you can purchase a whole roast chicken, then chop or shred the meat and store it in an airtight container for up to 4 days. Another healthy option (if you have the time) is to poach some chicken breasts to use throughout the week.

#### EGGS

Eggs are one of the most nutritious protein sources and are loaded with almost every vitamin and mineral needed by the human body. Boil a batch on Sunday and you've got instant protein that will keep for up to 1 week. Slice into green salads, mash into dressings, or keep a couple on hand for snacks.

To boil eggs, place your eggs in a saucepan and cover with cold water. Bring to the boil over medium-high heat, then cover, remove from the heat and set aside for 8-11 minutes (depending on how hard-boiled you like them – 8 minutes will yield a jammier yolk, while 11 minutes will give you a true hard-boiled egg). Drain, cool in iced water and peel just before adding to your salad.

### Teriyaki chicken noodle salad

190 g (6% oz) cooked ramen noodles, prepared as per packet instructions

100 g (% cup) shredded cooked chicken

Chicken delivers a lean protein boost in this Japaneseinspired salad, which is balanced with sweet pineapple and an easy teriyaki-sesame dressing that ties everything together.

- 1. Place all the salad ingredients in a bowl and toss lightly.
- 2. Combine the dressing ingredients in a small bowl.
- 3. Pour the dressing over the salad just before serving and toss well to coat.





### Chorizo, chickpea & roasted pepper noodle salad

Chorizo is a Spanish-style cured pork sausage that comes in many forms - including fresh and cured varieties. Fresh chorizo needs to be sliced and fried for a few minutes before use, while cured varieties require no cooking. Either can be used in this recipe.

180 g (6 % oz) thin hokkien moodles, prepared as per packet instructions

1 rossted red bell pepper (capsicum). finely sliced

50 g (1% oz) dried or smoked chorizo. finely sliced

85 g (3 oz) tinned chickpeas (garbanzo beans), drained and rinsed

W small red onion. finely sliced

100 g (3½ oz) cherry tomatoes, halved

30 g (1 cup) rocket (arugula) leaves

#### SHERRY VINAIGRETTE

1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil

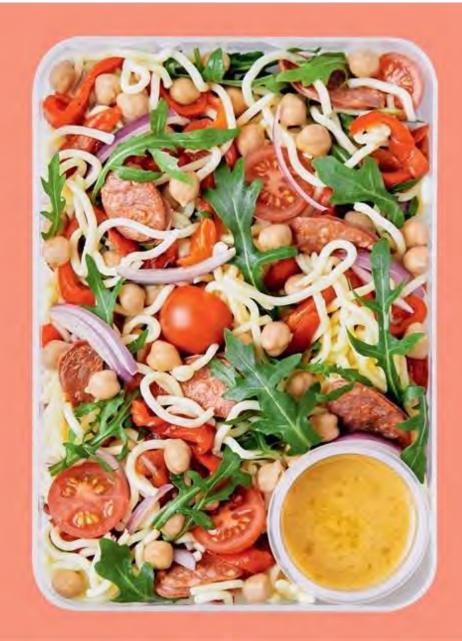
2 teaspoons sherry vinegar

1 teaspoon dijon mustard

1 temspoon agave syrup, honey or maple syrup

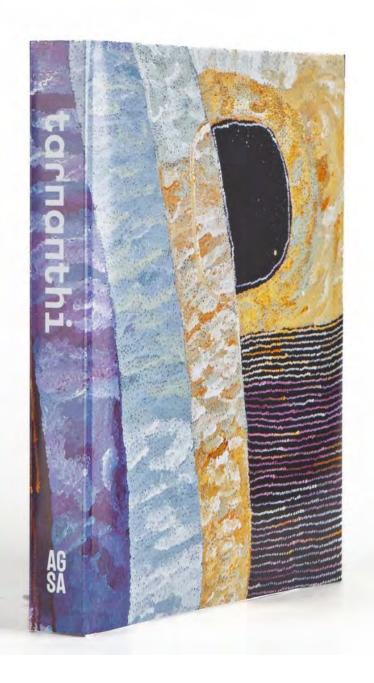
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## Tarnanthi 2025

The Tarnanthi 2025 catalogue celebrates the tenth anniversary of the Art Gallery of Australia's acclaimed Tarnanthi Festival of contemporary Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander art.

- Throughout its 328 pages, full-colour images capture the material splendor and diversity of works presented at the 2025 Tarnanthi Festival, held at AGSA and dozens of partner exhibitions across Adelaide and around South Australia.
- Handsomely bound as a hardcover edition, this richly illustrated and deeply informative publication is a must-have for lovers of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander art. It is both a memento of and tribute to ten years of one of Australia's foremost First Nations cultural events.

When I was a girl there was kulata around us, all the time. Kulata tiuta (many spears) of all sizes being made and, more importantly, kulata making being taught by the fires. Well, today it's like my childhood again on the Lands, with old men teaching young men to make spears. The spears are hard work to make; the skills have been passed down from men, one generation to the next. Traditionally the men used the spears to hunt, today they tell stories. With the spears the men make installations. Hundreds of spears together, used with light and sound. Through the spears, the old men are telling important stories of Country, culture and Law.<sup>4</sup>

This pedagogical Intent – with the senior men teaching the younger men – has coincided with, and been catalysed by, an expanding field of contemporary art opportunities for Anangu artists. Increased exhibition opportunities and greater exposure to art installations across the country, alongside Anangu perticipation in art fairs and art awards, have led to this rethinking of the place of the kulata. As a contemporary artist with an installation-based practice, Jones supported two artistic outcomes – the first of which was included in the 2014 Adelaide Biennial of Australian Art: Dark Heart, curated by Nick Mitzevich at the Art Gallery of South Australia, and the second, an outdoor contemporary art installation and Imma (cultural performance) on the grounds of Government House for the Art Gallery of South Australia's first Tarmanthi Festival, in 2015. These were the first two iterations of the Kulata Tjuta (many spears) project.

The decision by the senior men to hold the event on the grounds of Government House, adjacent to Parliament House, was a symbolic marking of the struggle that led to the Apango Pitjantjatjara Yankunytjatjara Land Rights Act 1881. Many of the artists had been in Adelaide decades before to press for the land rights legislation to be enacted, and during that time had camped along the river behind Parliament House and Government House.

The suspension of spears in the 2014 project gave way in 2015 to the vertical grounding of the spears, becoming at once a projection screen and a mise-en-scène. Whereas kujaţa previously occupied a liminal role between weapon and souvenir, through these installations and performances they were recast as contemporary art objects – and as return fire. In the words of initiator Mick Wikilyiri:

Kulata Tjuta means 'many spears'. When Anangu talk about Kulata Tjuta, we are talking about what we must fight for, and what we protect above all else. This is what is most important to Anangu. Through Kulata Tjuta, we protect Tjukurpa, Manta, Walytja – Law, Country, Family. This is what is most important!<sup>5</sup>

And as project initiator Kunmanara (Willy) Kaika Burton stated:

We know if culture is strong, Anangu will continue the fight with a strong spirit. Young men have always learned to make kujaţa (spears) through the old men, and through the old men like me, the fight will continue for a better future for Asanous.

These principles of intergenerational knowledge and cultural continuity are shared by the project and by Tarnanthi writ large. In 2017 the *Kulata Tjuta* project reached a point of significant culmination with the presentation of a major installation and accompanying moving-image work, again as part of Tarnanthi (pp. 114-15). In this work, now held in the collection of the Art Gallery of South Australia, 550 kujata made by Anangu men are suspended in an explosive formation, which hovers above a circular installation of hand-carved pitl (water carriers) made by Anangu women, in an artistic response to nuclear weapons-testing on

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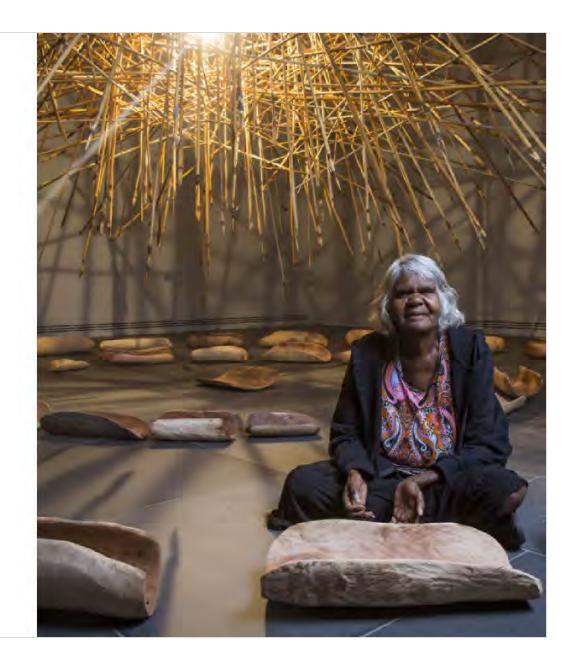
Country. Internally lit from a single light source, the radiating spear shafts cast shadows onto the surrounding walls, proliferating the artistic effect and impact and drawing an analogy to the cumulative and mushrooming consequences of the atomic bomb testing on Pitjantjatjara and Yankunytjatjara Country between 1953 and 1963, directly referenced in the work. At once mesmerising and gut wrenching, this installation immediately evoked the power of art to share our deep, dark history. In the accompanying six-channel moving-image work, many artists spoke publicly for the first time about their lived experiences, their deeply personal conversations interspersed with footage that takes the audience on an immersive journey through Anangu lands.

Born in Woomera in the prohibited weapons-testing area that encompasses the Maralinga atomic tests site, Kokathar/Nukum artist Yhomine Scarce responded to her own family history with a major glass installation, Thunder Raining Poisson, in the first Tarnathi exhibition at AGSA in 2015 (pp. 99, 105, 109). Over 1500 hand-blown glass yams suspended from the ceilling and emitting a glistering bluish light, representing a dissipating atomic bomb cloud, met audiences as they descended the staircase. Here the art museum registers not as a place of loss or absence, but as a place of presence and 'presencing' – an exhibition-making practice of community and cultural engagement, explored by Yamatji curator and academic Stephen Gillchrist, which seeks to counter the erasure of an object's meaning, title or maker's name or of past experiences." In the context of the Kujata Tjuta project and Scarce's Thunder Raining Poison, this can refer to the historical amnesia associated with the frontier wars and the unauthorised atomic testing on Abordginal land. For both projects, their presentation in Tarnathi initiated the first of many subsequent installations.

Lauded as a breakthrough work in the 2017 Tarnanthi Festival, this iteration of Kulafa Tjuta was a significant turning point. The work presented Itself as a response to the question of what happens when a tradition of weapon-making, spanning thousands of years, becomes contemporary art. In his response to the 2017 work, Professor Stephen Muccke described it as 'a kind of artistic 'payback'. In circling around the atomic events, it becomes its own event with past and future ramifications' <sup>18</sup> But his project had to be restorative for Agangu and, in the intersubjective space, where the roles of artist and curator are flexing and reforming, restoration emerges. As said by the late artist Mrs Kaika Burton, "Why is this story important for future generations? Well, the story maps Country and tells Agangu the secrets of that Country along the map, but the benefit of the story goes far further than this!" In 2025 the National Gallery of Australia installed the latest iteration of the project. Titled Tirkilpa, a word that describes the rattling of spears in preparation for battle, this iteration underscores that, for Agangu, the battle continues.

Mrs Kaika Burton goes on to comment on the importance of the Kulata Tjuta project for Agangu women. In a lineage of histories written by men about men, she says, 'this is a story about strong women. It is about women looking after each other, and working together to stay safe, 's' in this statement, Kaika Burton was calling up and bringing into being a future project. Titled Kungka Kuopu, this Tarnanthi touring exhibition, which commenced in 2022 and 'took flight' across the country over coming years, began with the holdings of work by Agangu women in the AGSA collection as the starting point. Critically, artists' engagement included the performance of inma at each regional venue and hence the ceremonial was positioned as a curatorial axis. The title was drawn with permission directly from another Tarnanthi premiere, this time the Kungka Kunpu film project by the Iwantja artists. As described by lead artist Kaylene Whiskay:

Reviewing Tarnanthi 2023 for The Saturday Paper, Claire G. Coleman seized on painter Vincent Namatjira's remark that 'art is a weapon', not surprisingly, given the political atmosphere of the post-referendum opening weekend with its thousands-strong assembly of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander exhibitors in town:

In this forever war, the strongest weapons my people - our people - have are art and story. This is a conflict of story and of negotiation. Whether intended or not, the art in Tarnanthi is a counterstrike: it says, you mess with our rights, we mess with your soul. When you try to destroy us with hate, we fight back with love,7

I imagine love is just one of the emotions that have inspired the 9477 artists who have participated in Tamanthi across the festival's first decade.<sup>8</sup> As far as it is possible to identify an overarching style or defining quality to these diverse, ambitious and sometimes experimental works, it's the complexity and range of ideas and media that offer insight, as well as pleasure, empathy and, yes, despair on occasion.

Weapon as metaphor is logical, but art stops short of maining its audiences. As Adelaide critic Stephanie Radok observed during Tarnanthi's inaugural season, 'art as a healing, constructive, community-building activity was very strong<sup>1,9</sup> The therapeutic has been a naturally evolving theme through the entire creative program and Aboriginal languages have been central. All Cobby Eckermann's Impressions from AGSA's floor in 2020 could translate to many Tarnanthi spaces:

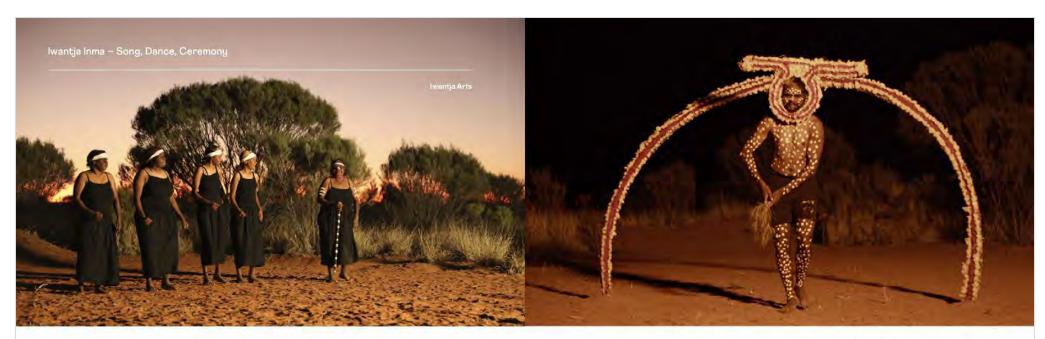

Depending on their proximity in time and space, these stories vary across cultures, yet it is clear in Australia's history that the cosmic tale is not only a lesson about survival and kinship, but also one about how to use the land. In Kungkarangkalpa: Seven Sisters, the canvas becomes a vibrant map with pulsating fields of patterning, celestial blues and warm reds, demonstrating where the sisters travelled to find solace. The artists affectively weave the sky and the earth together without boundaries, reinforcing the deep relationship between celestial movements and cultural identity to impart this story for future generations. As Kunmanara (Nyurpaya) Kaika Burton described the work:

the benefit of the story goes further than this. This is a story about ... women looking after each other, and working together to stay safe ... Women aren't facing the dangers of Wati Nyiru today in Alice Springs or Adelaide but they are surrounded by dangers and challenges.

Burton's words are a salient reminder that the tangible components of Kungkarangkalpa: Seven Sisters exist to share the intangible: that this is a map gifted to young Agangu by kungka kungu (strong women) to one day be understood and used to teach. This is identify and First Nations knowledge preserved for those who will keep culture strong through the holding of tlukurpa.

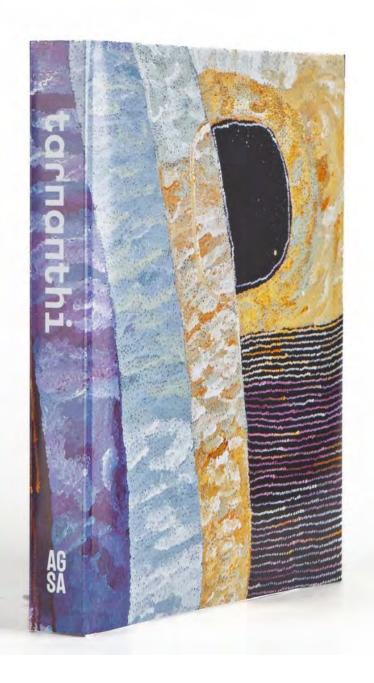
The Plelades and the Orion constellation are also central to two other major presentations by Tjunkaya Tapaya OAM and the Tjanpi Desert Weavers. Both works take a different approach to expressing the sky's influence, incorporating celestial storytelling into the very fibres of everyday life. In the Tjanpi Desert Weavers' Pasrpakeni (Take flight), 2011, Orion – ambodied as Wati Nyiru – is depicted astrict the sculptural form of a bird woven from tjanpi (grass), symbolising movement and transformation. In Tispaya's several works called Kungkarangkalpa (Seven Sisters), 2020, the artist etches figurative representations of the sisters' falle into clay.

I consider Kungkarangkaipa (Seven Sisters) a major body of work that represents a critical contribution to the documentation of the Seven Sisters narrative, blending distinctive gestural mark making with Pitjantjajera annotations. Employing the sgraffito technique, Tapaya's vessels carry a raw, tactile quality, which reflects the artist's hand and her material engagement with Country.

Tapaya's work is particularly significant in expanding the optetemological framework through which the Pleiades and Orion are understood. Traditionally transmitted through oral storytelling, the Seven Sisters narrative finds an alternative mode of inscription in her annotated ceramics. In doing so, her work positions Indigenous written records within the broader realm of accounts of the Pleiades, challenging the privileging of Western archival and non-oral traditions, while also affirming the enduring presence and transmission of Indigenous knowledges.

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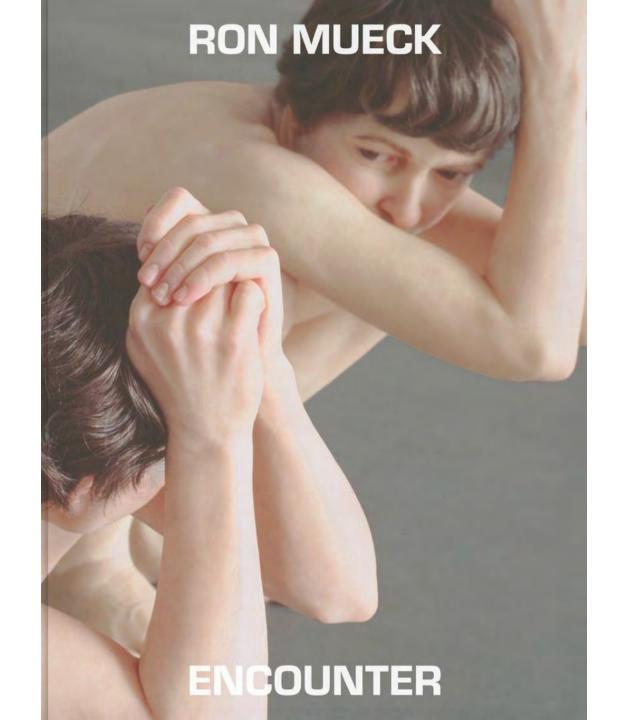

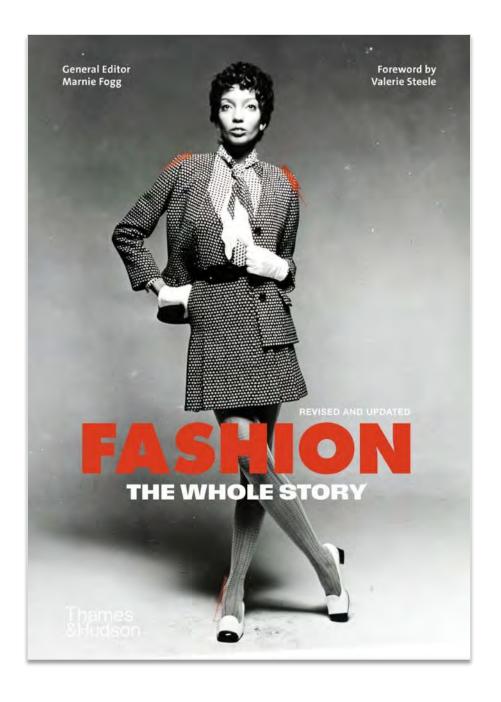

### NAVIGATOR

he sari has been the traditional women's garment of the Indian subcontinent for centuries, although many Muslim women favoured tailored shirts and trousers and certain Hindu groups in western India traditionally wore qhaqhra (skirts) and choli (short blouses). In this painting from Thanjavur in Tamil Nadu, a barber's wife can be seen dressed in the traditional draped sari with her husband wearing the dhoti, its male equivalent. The woman wears a short bodice underneath: it has sometimes been suggested that the bodice was introduced by Muslims or Westerners, but tailored bodices have a much longer history in India. Essentially a long piece of cloth wrapped around the body, the sari cloth varied tremendously in length and breadth, with simple saris worn by village women measuring 18 inches (45 cm) by 70 inches (180 cm), while the lavish 'nineyard saris' of central India measured about 43 inches (110 cm) by 30 feet (9 m). The use of large amounts of cloth to swathe the body was a clear indication of affluence: a sari that merely covered the body marked a person with no money for extra cloth. Materials varied from sumptuous silk and gold-wrapped thread used in the saris of Varanasi and Kanchipuram, to hand-spun, hand-woven cotton in rural examples. A sari could be draped in innumerable ways, with each region of India traditionally having its own style. RC

# 1 DRAPING The drape of the san is typical of south India, with the lower portion pleated and wrapped around the waist and the remainder draped so that it can either be worn pulled across the front or

falling down the back.

The simple pattern of the fabric is a repeat design of stylized leaf motifs trimmed with plain narrow borders on both edges. Red is a popular colour for saris, especially in south India where it is considered auspicious.

# Robe Volante 1705 WOMEN'S DRESS

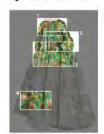


French emerald green satin robe volante with lampas weave (1735).



he robe volunte first appeared in 1705 and represented a more relaxed informal style of female dress, which corresponded to the libertarian emancipated atmosphere of the Regency period. The garment has since become known as the 'Watteau robe', after the painter Antoine Watteau, who depicted many women in early versions of it. However, contemporaries referred to it as a sacque, contouche or robe volante. The robe volante developed out of the robe battante - a baroque dressing gown - and fastened at the front to show the lacing of the corps and the chemise underneath. The chemise gave the silk robes a grip, and hinted at the derobed female body.

This dress reflects the rich palette of the early reign of Louis XV and an interest in oriental design. At the back neckline, a demi-cape descends to the ground in matching material to the main dress. It is stiffened by wide box pleats, which could themselves be made slightly rigid by whale or willow boning. Although the robe volunte was too Informal for court dress, the cape became a feature of some robes à la française and developed into a train or an informal pleated kickback jacket, known as a pet. This dress is not lavishly trimmed, but other robes volantes are decorated with silk rosettes on the fastenings, or cut with pinked hems. PW



### TOCAL POINTS



The wide box pleats at the shoulder of the cape show how each ready-made robe could be adjusted for its wearer, slight alterations the width of which never reached the extremes of formal court to the pleats could hint at the figure beneath. This cape was attached to the squared-off neckline with buttons or hooks.



The robe volunte is worn with a gently rounded petticoat pannier, dress. This made the dress relatively practical for everyday wear and it was adopted by women from all ranks of society.



#### 2 RAQUETTE SLEEVES

The tight-fitting raquette sleeves are straight cut to the elbow. where they expand into flat, folded-open cuffs. This cut echoes the straight back and the rounded skirts of the robe volunte. Cuffs might also be tiered frills made from matching materia.



### 4 PRINTED FABRIC

The fabric indicates the wealth of the wearer This sumptuous lampas silk, woven in France, incorporates expensive metallic thread into its bold-relief Chinese peony design. The breadth of the robe makes it particularly suitable for the display of large prints.

### Little Black Dress 1926

COCO CHANEL 1883 - 1971





redited as the originator of the perennial classic 'little black dress', Parisian couturière Coco Chanel designed a quintessential and iconic garment that democratized elegance. Although she had previously introduced black dresses, from as early as 1913, the severe refined cut of the chemise-style dress of the 1920s lent itself to the dramatic geometric patterning of an era in thrall to the motifs of Art Deco. Described by US Vogue magazine in October 1926 as 'The Chanel "Ford", the frock that all the world will wear', because its mass appeal rivalled that of the Ford Model T car, the little black dress entered the fashion lexicon as a fail-safe staple that could be worn by all women, whatever their economic class.

Constructed along the parallel lines and dropped waist of the chemise dress, this little black cocktail dress is distinguished from daywear by the luxuriousness of the fabric and decoration. The black crêpe de Chine shift falls just on the knee, and is embellished with deep headed fringing that forms an asymmetric hemline. The horizontal straight cut line of the neck is softened by the curved edges of a hip-length bolero, edged with beads. initially the wearing of black was restricted to mourning, but Chanel made it the smart choice for the newly established early evening 'cocktail hour'; a social gathering of private soirées that lasted from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m., enjoyed by the 'flapper', a notoriously free-spirited young woman who supposedly led a hedonistic lifestyle. ### TOCAL POINTS



#### 1 FLATTENED BOSOM

Epitomizing the garçonne look of the 1920s, the chemise dress released the wearer from the constraints of the hourglass corset. Although the waistline was no longer emphasized, the long, lean lines of the garment required that the profile of the breasts be suppressed beneath a flattener or bandeau. The flattened bosom also allowed the long multistranded necklaces that were popular accessories at the time to hang straight down the front of the dress.



#### 2 EMBELLISHMENT

The simple shape of the chemise dress provides the perfect base for elaborate embellishment that reflects and catches the light, giving the impression of movement. The intricate beadwork would have been executed by hand by workers (petites mains) in the atelier. The petites mains numbered in their thousands during the 1920s, and serviced the great couture houses of the era, including Patou. Callot Soeurs and Edward Molyneaux.



### 3 'NUDE' LEG As hemlines rose during the

1920s, the shortened length of the skirt created a need for sheer modern hosiery Previously knitted on a circular machine and steamed into shape, which meant that with wear they bagged at the knee and ankle, stockings began to be fully fashioned in the 1920s. They were made in two pieces and sewn together, knitted in beige or flesh-toned silk so that the legs appeared naked, apart from the seam up the back of the leg.



#### 4 ASYMMETRIC HEMLINE

Various devices were deployed to ease the transition from the shorter skirts of the earlier part of the decade to the mio-calf length commonly seen in the 1930s. These include the handkerchief point hem, comprising triangular godets that break up the hemline; a transparent underskirt that is visible from the knee down; and, as employed here by Chanel, an asymmetric hemline that is created by the addition of different lengths of jet head strings.

These evening dresses by Balenciaga were inspired by paintings by Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec.



A dmired for his masterful manipulation of fabric, Cristóbal Balenciaga was particularly well known for using textiles that were sculptural in nature, especially silk gazar This heavy, stiff silk has a resistant quality and matt texture, and the fabric is used here to create the pink ruffled underskirt of the black silk velvet dress. This garment is sculpted to follow the lines of the body to the knee, where the undulating curves extend outwards into a bell shape, ending just above the calf and supported by the stiffened underskirt. The back of the skirt is cut into a deep curve towards the ankle and ends in a centre-back seam, where the cloth is cut on the cross of the weave. This forms a small fishtail train that billows when the wearer moves.

The pared-down design of these evening dresses is typical of the couturier's evolution from the embellished grandeur of his earlier designs, which were resonant of his Spanish heritage, to an almost monastic aesthetic, with the emphasis on form. Previously, etiquette had decreed that arms should remain covered until 8 p.m., but the popularity of the cocktail party in the 1950s, which generally took place between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m., resulted in a plethora of sleeveless and décolleté garments, frequently worn with a pair of over-the-elbow suede gloves and a matching stole. #### 1 CORSETED BODICE

Exposing the shoulders, the bodice of this strapless dress is boned be shape. forming peaks on each side of the breasts that produce a shallow "Y siape. The line is matched exactly by the top edge of the over the elbow gloves.



#### 2 UNDULATING WAIST SEAM

The waist seam gently undulates to sit in the small of the back and rises slightly at the front to provide a flattering slimmer silhouette on a curvier form. Balenciage was expert at cutting off a line just before a curve would take the eye into unflattering proportions.



#### 3 CANTILEVERED SKIRT

Balenciaga utilizes the cantilevered skirt to create a sculptural form inspired by the lines and potential for movement inherent in the Spanish flamenco dress. This is evident in the ruffled tiers of silk gazar that make up the underskirt.

### DESIGNER PROFILE

Ithough the Ivy League style was known and loved for its precision and Attention to detail, the lvy dresser was also celebrated for his innate ability to look simultaneously casual and carefree. This knowing nonchalance was facilitated by the ascendancy of athletic programmes at the Ivies, and the social status bestowed on these athletes encouraged sports clothing to be worn on and off the playing field. Most of the collegians were also almost certainly from what the economist and writer Thorstein Veblen called the 'leisure class'-wealthy families with a natural affinity for leisurely pursuits, such as golfing and tennis, requiring attire that could be worn for both sporting and social occasions. A particular item of clothing that epitomized the relaxed nature of the Ivy look was the award-letter sweater, also known as the Varsity or Letterman sweater. It was ultimately an emblem of achievement and superiority as it was awarded only to the most illustrious players, thereby creating a hierarchy within the team and granting the honoured athletes minor celebrity status. Another garment of iconic status to fill collegiate wardrobes was US army chinos, which emerged as a symbol of victory after World War II, making the transition from military associations to civilian life. This staple of Ivy apparel was perfectly offset by the ever-popular lightweight, waistlength Harrington jacket, a checked shirt-ordinarily worn with the tails trailing behind-

and a trusty pair of loafers or tennis shoes. RA

#### 1 AWARD-LETTER 'P' SWEATER

Declaring to everyone on campus the wearer's status as most valuable player, the black Princeton award-letter sweater is unmistakable, emblazoned here with an orange felt 'P'. The girlfriends of the chosen athletes would often borrow these sweaters and experience the enormous prestige they granted.



Otherwise known as a 'Harvard Clip', 'Princeton' or simply 'Ivy League', this particular type of haircut was defined as long enough for the hair to be parted on one side yet still extremely short at the back and on the sides. The crew cut was adopted by the US army in World War II and later became popular in civilian life.

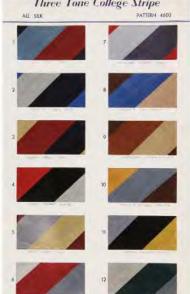


The unparalleled popularity of the leather loafer could be seen on any East Coast campus, with the Bass 'Weejuns' monopolizing the market. The shoe was named after the traditional Norwegian fisherman's slipper, which ironically was based on the Native American meccasin. Alden and Winthorp were also popular brands.



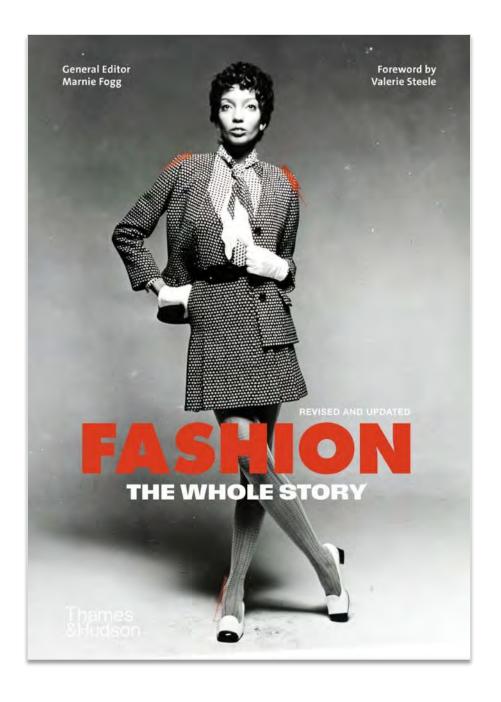

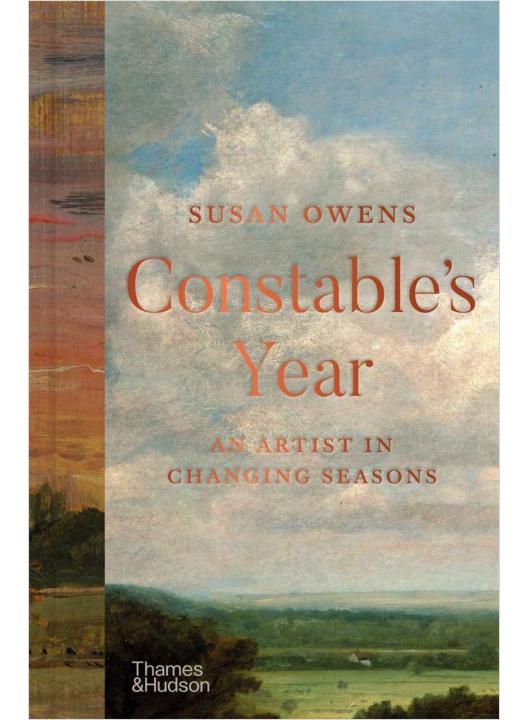

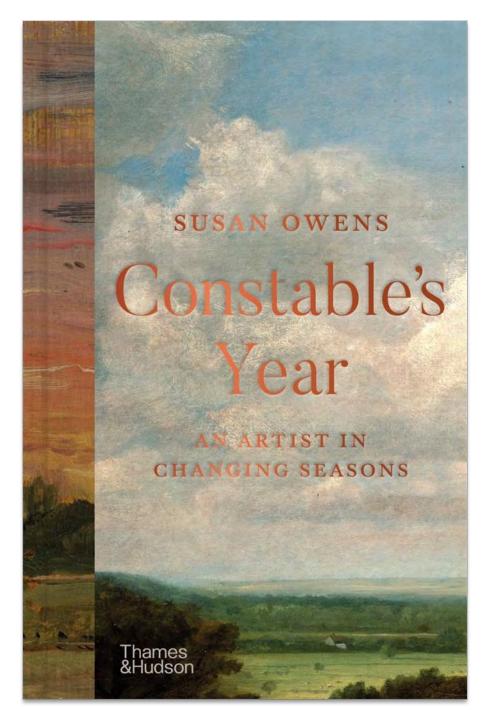

## Introduction

A fellow artist once said that Constable's pictures made him reach for his greatcoat, his umbrella.' Constable himself described one of his paintings as 'exhilarating, fresh & and blowing', as though a breeze came from its surface.' Stand in front of *The Hay Wain* today, shut out the hum of the gallery and let your eyes wander over the scene: after a few seconds the still warmth of a summer's noon will come to meet you, an atmosphere so rich it could make you drowsy. Or look at Constable's rapid, hasty oil sketches, his dispatches from lanes and towpaths. They tell you far more than what the landscape looks like; they tell you about the blustery wind and the flickering of sunlight through leaves, the thickening of the air before a storm.

Constable achieved this by lying down under trees and watching the way the branches and leaves moved above him. By lavishing more attention on hedges than anyone but farmworkers. By gazing into ditches, rapt, claiming that he could see great subjects down there. In his day, most artists followed convention when they painted the English landscape; they idealized and generalized and inadvertently buried the truth. Landscape painting had become a hall of mirrors, led more by other paintings than by the appearance of nature itself. Constable rejected these ambitions as 'seeking the truth at second hand'. Instead, he set out to paint the landscape as it actually looked – and felt – under showery, brightening English skies. His passionate, dogged determination to represent the vivid colours of nature and his startlingly fresh evocations of being outdoors on heaths, canal sides and country lanes set him apart from artists of his own time, but resulted in paintings that ring as true as ever today.

Just then, Constable's mind was on death as well as new life: that of Dr Rhudde, who had died three days previously. 'Was it not singular', he asked Maria, 'that I should arrive in the village just as the bell was tolling for the Doctor?'46 The rector had long since ceased to exercise his malevolent control over the couple, but whether Constable was conscious of it or not, the news that they were finally free of him appears to have made his own spirit soar.

Another brief springtime visit to Suffolk, in April 1821, found Constable in a particularly reflective and nostalgic mood, even for him. I have called on most of the neighbours – drank tea at Ann's last evening – had a stormy walk home over the heath', he wrote to Maria.

How sweet and beautifull is every place & I visit my old haunts with renewed delight but filled with many regrets & not without many sad & melancholy reflections on the various and solemn changes since the days of my youth. Nothing can exceed the beautiful green of the meadows, which are beginning to fill with buttercups, & various flowers – the birds are singing from morning till night most of all the sky larks. How delightfull is the country, but I long to get back to what is still more dear to me.<sup>47</sup>

Bergholt Common. It was being ploughed to prepare it for sowing, which prompted him to make two rapid pencil drawings of the scene, one of which stretches across both pages of a sketchbook opening to form a panoramic view. He also made a small, sketchy oil that is thought to have been painted in his London studio rather than on the spot, because it is so similar in detail to the double-page drawing. Instead of his more usual paper, he has used an oak panel – the grain is clearly visible through the paint – and has left patches of the wood untouched in some areas where it could serve to represent earth. (Or rather, he thriftily re-used the panel: he had already painted one side with a night scene of Church Street in East Bergholt.) The result is a picture of not much happening in a flat and relatively featureless landscape. There is a tree on the left and a ploughman with two horses on the right, with a prominent windmill and, on the distant horizon, a church and village. What drama there is comes from the





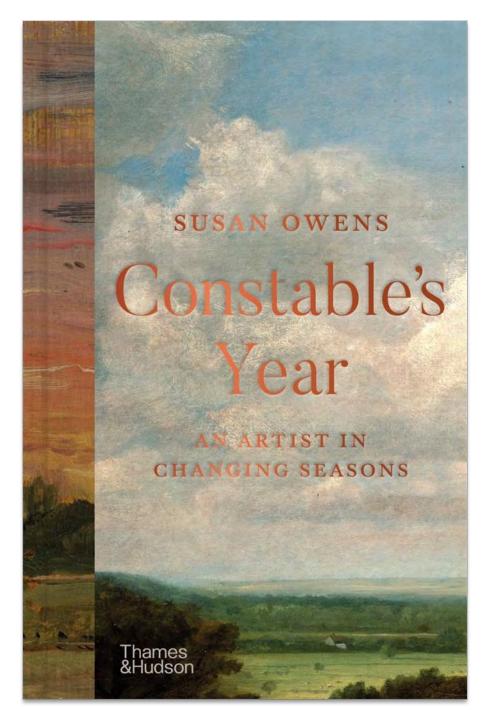

### My beloved Bergholt

East Bergholt was to Constable what the Alps were to J. M. W. Turner. During the summer months, Constable's near-contemporary - born the previous year to him - travelled regularly in France, Italy and Switzerland when the French Revolutionary and later Napoleonic wars permitted, and throughout England, Scotland and Wales when they didn't. To choose a single year, 1819, when the continent had reopened to British tourists following the Battle of Waterloo, Turner travelled to Turin, Como, Venice, Rome and Naples, returning via Florence and the Mont Cenis pass; Constable rented a cottage in Hampstead for his young family and on one occasion popped back to East Bergholt. It was not that he was inherently averse to such trips - he had, after all, toured the Peak District in 1801 and in 1806 had spent seven weeks sketching in the Lake District, a highly productive visit that gave him enough material for several exhibition pictures. It was just that the more he drew and painted the buildings, lanes and fields around East Bergholt, the more interesting they became. The tenant farmer Willy Lott's house may have been a familiar part of the scene, but Constable found it no less absorbing for that: a different viewpoint could change everything. Moment by moment the light and weather altered its colour and form and kept drawing him back. If he took just a few steps down the towpath, the trees, river, bridge and buildings reconfigured themselves. He could sketch the lock on the Stour near his father's mill at Flatford on a stormy afternoon, under clouds the colour of a pewter plate; and he could paint it again on a fine day, feeling the warmth of the sun on his back, a shaft of sunlight slicing

#### Historical Background

From a historical perspective, the typefaces we use today originate from the so-called 'roman'. The letterforms are based on the Humanistic minuscule and the majuscules of the Capitalis Monumentalis used by the Ancient Romans. The first typefaces of this kind arose under the

influence of Humanism at the time of the Renaissance in the 15th century, at first in Italy and later in France. Additional forms were developed during the 17th and 18th centuries. The latter of those variants is characterised above all by more extreme stroke contrast and the increasing loss of the dynamic letterforms inspired by writing.

#### Disambiguation

In typography, the expression 'roman' originally described the rounded-arched letterforms of Roman origin, differentiated from blackletter styles. The corresponding German term 'Antiqua' grew out of the Renaissance 'lettera antiqua' - a style of handwriting supposedly based on a model from antiquity. However, the reference point for the lower-case letters was not a writing style used by the Romans, but rather the Carolingian minuscule used in Charlemagne's time for copying classical texts. The term 'Serif' refers to the concluding horizontal flicks or 'feet' at the end of a typeface's strokes. Its name probably comes from the Dutch word schreef, for stroke or line. In today's context, the term 'Serif' is often applied to the group of serif typefaces with stroke contrast, as opposed to Sans Serif and Slab Serif.

The Script subcategory includes typefaces based on the calligraphic character of handwriting. The historical models, so-called vernacular styles, were mainly used in correspondence. In contrast to the Graphic typefaces, the letters in most Script typefaces are connected, so that it seems as if whole words were written in one go.

#### Historical Background

Individual handwriting styles and calligraphic models from before and after the invention of printing serve as the basis for printed Script typefaces. The shapes and stroke patterns of Script typefaces are strongly influenced by the

writing tools used in the respective handwritten models (e.g., pen, brush, chalk, etc.). Because of their difficult legibility, Script typefaces are generally not suitable for longer amounts of text and are often only used for headlines or to serve a decorative purpose.

#### Mean-Height

The Mean-Height, usually called the x-height, is a term describing the height of a typeface's lower-case letters without ascenders and descenders.

#### Minuscule

A term for the small letters of an alphabet (also called lower-case letters).

#### Neck

The vertical stroke on the right-hand side of the letter 'G' is called the Neck (or Shaft).

#### Out-Stroke

As a term, the Out-Stroke (and also the Terminal, or Stroke Terminal) refer to how the end of a stroke that is part of a letterform is designed. Some Out-Strokes end in clearly-formed Terminals. These Terminals can take various forms. For instance, the Terminal at the top of a lowercase 'a' or at the bottom of the lower-case 'y' might be a round object. In that case, it is referred to as a 'Ball Terminal.'

#### Serifs

Serifs (also sometimes called 'feet') are the concluding horizontal flicks at the end of a typeface's strokes. One distinguishes between Head Serifs and Foot Serifs. The word 'Serif' probably comes from the Dutch schreef, for stroke or line. The Capitalis Monumentalis or the Capitalis Quadrata are generally considered to be the origin of the Serifitself. It is assumed that Serifs developed less from a technical need and more because of formal aesthetic

#### General Terms

#### Capitalis Monumentalis

The Capitalis Monumentalis is the style of inscriptional letterforms used on monuments in the Roman Empire. It only has majuscule letters. The proportions of the letterforms are based on the square or are derived from squares. The letters were drawn onto a stone with a wide brush and then carved, which is why this style is also called Lapidary (from the Latin lapis, for 'stone').

#### Carolingian Minuscule

The Carolingian Minuscule is a handwriting style once used for book text. It was developed during the second half of the 8th century and is characterised by a clear and simple appearance. Under Charlemagne's rule, it quickly spread from the Carolingian Empire's writing centres (including Aachen, Tours, and Reims) to places across Europe. The letters from the Gothic Minuscule - and the later Humanistic Minuscule that emerged out of it - were ultimately the predecessors of the Latin script's lower-case.

#### Character

An element in a typeface's character set is called a Character or a glyph. For example, this can be a letter, a ligature or a punctuation mark.

#### **Gothic Minuscule**

The Gothic Minuscule is a handwriting style once used for book text. It was developed in scriptoria during the Gothic period in the Middle Ages. It emerged around 1100, replacing the Carolingian Minuscule. Around 1300, it influenced the development of a later book hand: Textura.

#### Humanistic Minuscule

The Humanistic Minuscule is a hand-writing style once used for book text. It developed out of the Carolingian Minuscule and emerged in Florence and Padua at the beginning of the 15th century. The lower-case letters for the Latin script grew out of this style.

#### Script

The term 'Script' describes a system of characters that represent language visually.

#### **Texture**

Texture refers to the visual appearance of the characters in a typeface and the overall impression they give in a text. Various factors influence Texture, including the proportions of letters and their stroke thickness. Typefaces can be distinguished from one another by their textures, too.

#### Type Classification

Type Classification refers to the division of typefaces into typeface categories and subcategories. A typeface's various character properties can be useful in classification. There are different classification approaches. For instance, typefaces can be grouped according to chronological or formal aspects. Despite their provenance, these patterns are reminiscent of the art of Australia's indigenous peoples.

THE BLOSSOM OF the trees and shrubs in the Acacia family has been adopted as Australia's national floral emblem. Only 120 of the 900 Acaria species are edible (others are quite toxic), the most popular being Acacia victoriae and Acacia aneura, collectively known as wattle. Wattleseed has been harvested by indigenous people for over 6,000 years. Unripe green wattleseeds are steamed out of their leguminous seedpods before being dried, roasted and ground. The resulting espresso-like powder smells of coffee, hazelnut, raisin and chocolate and can be brewed in espresso machines to make wattle liquid, used in everything from juices and smoothies to casseroles, pilafs and pavlova (a more contested Australian national symbol). Ground wattleseed can be added to breads, biscuits, scones and creamy or chocolatey desserts. Wattleseed is still used to make damper, a traditional Australian soda bread baked in the coals of a fire. Wattleseed is increasingly popular in Antipodean restaurant cuisine, where a new interest in bush foods has taken hold. Kangaroo steaks crusted with wattleseed and served with a chocolate and red wine sauce would not look odd on an Australian menu. It also works well in dry rubs for beef, lamb or chicken and is a great partner for mushrooms.





#### Black Cardamom

Not to be confused with green cardamom, black cardamom is much larger and hairier, with a strong, smoky and more camphorous flavour.

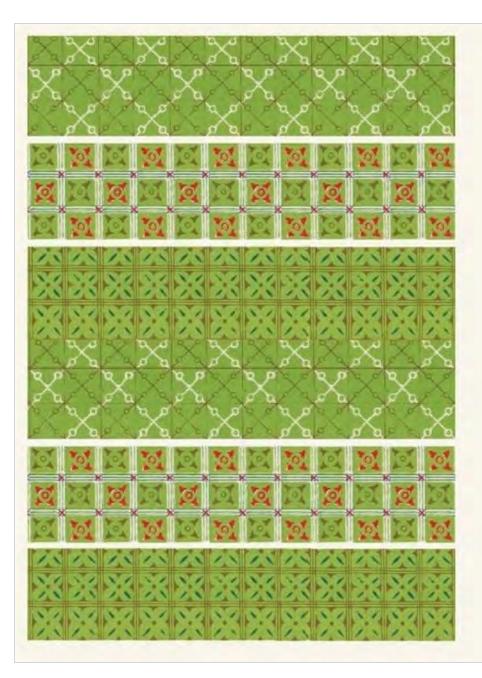
A network growing beneath and rising above the earth: these patterns in combination seem to evoke the complexity of this spice.

ALSO KNOWN AS hill cardamom, winged cardamom and Bengal cardamom, black cardamom is a warming spice (in contrast to cooling green cardamom) and an important element in garam masala (page 200). A member of the Zingiberaceae family, its seeds have a bold and brash camphor-like flavour, retinous and earthy, with a smoky taste that comes from being dried over an open fire. Underneath all that is a note of green cardamom (page 94), with its unmistakable menthol quality, giving black cardamom a satisfying and complex aftertaste.

Native to damp forest areas from Nepal to central China, the black cardamom plant has broad, leafy evergreen shoots that can reach a metre in height. The shape of the leaves gives rise to the spice's Latin name, subulatum, meaning 'awl-shaped'. The pretty ivory flowers appear at ground level and are followed by the seedpods, which contain three double rows of about six pods each.

In China, black cardamom is used in jin jin braised meat disher, in Vietnam it is called than qua and used in pho. Use whole black cardamom pods in any recipe that celebrates the art of slow cooking, so the spice can release its fat- and water-soluble oils. They are also great with bitter, slow-cooked greens and elevate simple lentil and rice dishes. Once stripped from the pods and ground, the tar-black seeds begin to lose their flavour and are best used immediately. They are often included in rubs for meats, especially beef, and are commonplace in North Indian curries.

#### Coriander Seed

Virgil wrote a poem about moretum, a kind of Roman pesto, that included a description of coriander seeds 'trembling on their slender thread'.

PEFFERY, WOODY CORTANDER seed - which is actually a fruit, consisting of two seeds in a crisp coating - has a long and illustrious history. In 1983 archaeologists found a stash of coriander seeds, undisturbed for over 8,000 years, in the Nahal Hemar cave in the hills above the Dead Sea. Coriander seeds were also found among the gold and jewels of Tutankhamun's tomb: the spice was considered an essential provision for the ancient Egyptian journey to the afterlife. The Roman cookery book Den cogninaria contains recipes that include coriander seeds, such as lentils with chestnuts and 'Alexandrian marrows'. Slightly more recently, in 1226 cz., Muhammad bin Hassan al-Baghdadi wrote Kitab al-Tabikh (The Book of Dishes) containing 159 Arab recipes, many of which include coriander seed alongside cumin (page 84), ginger (page 186) and green cardamom (page 94). The famed eighteenth-century French chef Vincent la Chapelle, cook to the Prince of Orange, included an elegant recipe in his Le Cuisivier mederne (1736) for a basting liquor for spit-roasted turkey made from 'two glasses of champagne ... aromatized with cloves, bay leaves, garlic, sliced lemon and coriander seeds'.

Coriander is used both as a spice (the seeds) and as a herb (the leaves and stems); the herb is often called 'cilantro' in North America. The seed is cultivated worldwide, including in India, Iran, eastern Europe and Central and North America. Its flavour is gentle, with sweet, peppery, floral notes and a mellow hint of orange peel. The spice is used in many cuisines across the world. In one of British chef Elizabeth David's Mediterranean-inspired recipes, mushrooms

Saffron-coloured with red for the stamens and green for the leaves, these patterns are from Persia, where the spice may have originated.

ORIGINATING IN WESTERN Asia, and possibly Persia, saffron is praised in the Bible, Homer's Ilied and Virgil's poems. Alexander the Great reportedly used it in his bath to cure battle wounds. Saffron travelled to Asia via Persia, where Buddhist monks used it to dye their robes (turmeric soon became a cheaper alternative). Around the year 960 cs., saffron was introduced to Spain by the Arabs, though it was not until the thirteenth century that it was cultivated more widely in Italy, France, England and Germany, after crusaders and pilgrims returned with saffron corms (swollen stem bases). The medieval French cookbook Le Viandier de Taillevent (c. 1300) contained a recipe for golden swan, which invites the chef to 'endore the feathers and head with a paste made of egg yolks mixed with saffron and honey'. Nowadays Spain is one of the main producers - Spanish saffron from the region of La Mancha is especially prized and has EU Protected Designation of Origin status - along with Iran, Greece, Kashmir and Morocco.

Often compared to gold in price (although it is actually a little cheaper), saffron is a very expensive and labour-intensive spice.

Only the leafless blue crocus — Crocus satieus — yields these curly, thread-thin, richly orange and red stigmas. The flowers blossom for only a few weeks every autumn and the stigmas can only be picked by hand, with 150,000 purple crocus flowers required to make one kilo of dried saffron threads. The picking, plucking and drying — often done by teams of families on long-established saffron farms — is likely to be followed by much partying.

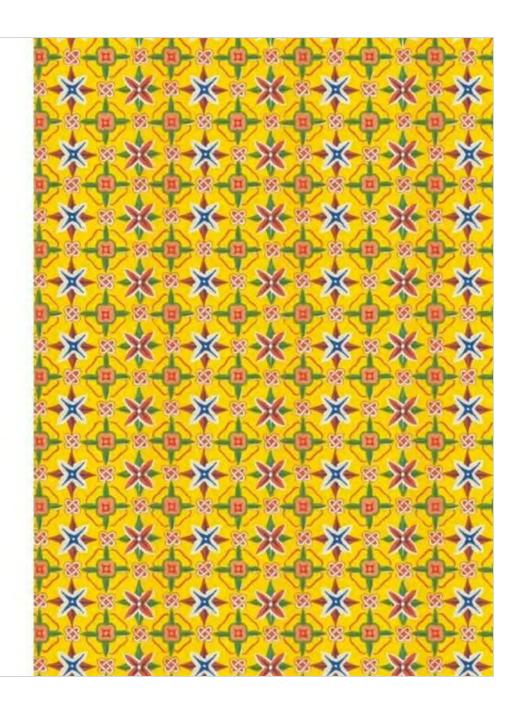




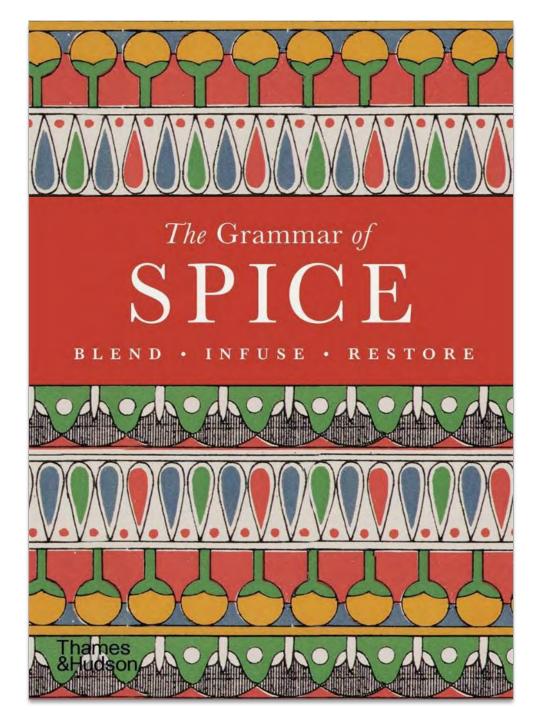

This pungent, musky, floral space is hauntingly sophisticated in aroma and taste, its aristocratic subtlety unsurpassed. Fortunately, given that it is the world's most expensive space, only a little is needed in order to release its houseyed, hay-like warmth into a dish. Saffron is one of the few water-toluble spices, which means it needs to be steeped in a little warm water to release its flavour and colour – the water turns a certain shade of summer-sunset red. You can also add the strands to dishes whole, with three per person being a good rule of thumb. Bear in mind that the aftertaste can linger, resulting in an almost medicinal bitterness if you used too generous a clamp. This is certainly not a spice to overdo.

Sultry suffron is inclispensable in some classic European dishes: the bouillabalise of Marseille, Catalan paella and Milanese risotto. In India, saffron is used in biryanis, in the sweet, yogurt-based Jodhpuri drink lam, and in shahi ram, a leg of lamb marinated for three days, then roasted and served with suffron raisin sauce. Saffron works well with seafood, chicken and rabbit, and also lends its magic to sweet dishes, such as creamy rice puddings and custards, the Iranian dessers shalzard, and the famous saffron bread of Cornwall. In Sweden, haselatt—literally 'Lucy cat'—are saffron-flavoured lums, eaten during Advent. In Arab countries, saffron is mixed with cardamom to flavour coffee.

- Danish modernism is widely known for its emphasis on minimalism, function and restraint, but a lesser-explored part of this design history is that of Danish textile design. The vibrant application of color and pattern taps into the concurrent history of abstract modernism, Scandinavian traditions of crasftmanship and the modernist principle of high design as part of everyday life.

By the late 1920s, Morie Gudine Leth and Gudrum Stig Augmard reintroduced textile printing in Denmark. Modernism was gaining ground, leading to a demand for a wider selection of affordable quality textiles. Marie Gudine Leth explicitly aimed to 'elevate textile printing to the same level as other disciplines within Danish decorative arts'.

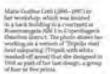
In 1930, during a stay at the Kunstgewerbeschule (School of Arts and Crafts) in Frankfurt am Main, Marie Gudme Leth was called back to Copenhagen to bead the testile printing programme at the newly established School of Arts and Crafts there. The school was located at the Museum of Decorative Art in Bredgade and was the result of the merger of the museum's Craft School, founded in 1901, with the decorative art department at the Technical Society's Schools. The new school taught artistic disciplines, such as drawing, composition and colour studies. A study tour of a textile factory in Munich in 1934 gave Marie Gudme Leth Insight into the screen-printing technology. Compared to block printing, screen printing offered entirely new possibilities. It was not just faster, it was also more accurate. Marie Gudme Leth realized that the screen-printing technology made it possible to produce yard goods in a workshop setting. This in turn brought her closer to her dream of practising textile printing as a decorative art form while creating products that were affordable for a wider audience.

In 1935, Marie Gudnie Leth founded the company Danisk Kaltimiryskieri (Danish Calicoe Printing) with support from a number of investors. She had her break-through with an exhibition at Magasin-BO in Copenhagen in 1932. That same year, ber textiles appeared in the Danish pavilion at the World's Fairs in Paris, and, two years later, New York. Marie Gudme Leth made a name for herself with distinctive, elegant leaf and flower prints in a bright and limited colour scale.

Marie Gudme Leth left Dansk Kattuntrykker in 1940 and founded an independent studio, which she continued to operate, with a number of assistants, until the 1960s. Looking at her prolific production of printed textiles over this period of about 30 years, we can trace both the technological development from the characteristics of block printing to the possibilities of screen printing and the stylistic development in pattern preferences. She enriched as with beautiful designs, such as 'Meadow Flowers' (1940), 'Guinea Fowf' (1941), 'Cherry' (1946), 'Tripoli' and 'Beirnt' (1958).

Marie Gudme Leth was a contemporary of several other talented textile printers, but hers is a particularly rich legacy, both thanks to her innovative - and now classic - patterns and through her feaching at the School of Arts and Crufts. Many regard Marie Gudme Leth as the personification of Danish textile printing, and her status today remains undiminished.



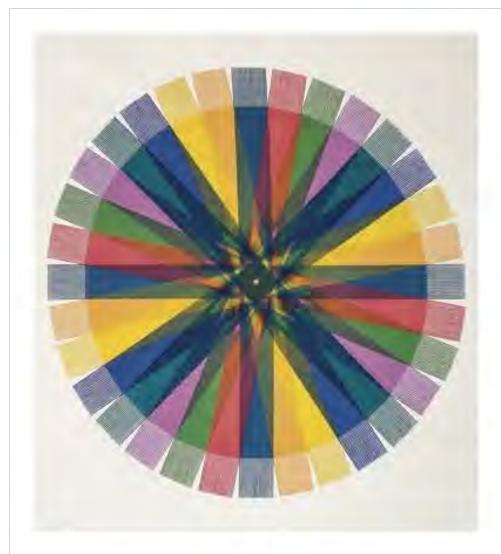




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### Modernism

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> The style of 1940s patterns was characterized by a rich presence of flowers, vines and animals. Many patterns had a decidedly romantic expression. Several designers drew inspiration from historical styles, for example the nomantic, cultivated floral patterns of the 18th century. This could be described as a return wave, a search for reassuring comfort in a tumultuous world through a return to stylistic expressions from the past.

> An interior design guide from 1931 recommended choosing light-coloured fabric without a pattern for curtains and hand-woven, monochrome fabrics with a textured pattern for furniture upholstery. In this light, it is interesting to consider the success of Danish textile printing during the late 1930s and into the 1940s and the popularity of many of Marie Gudme Leth's patterns with animals, flowers and bright colours.

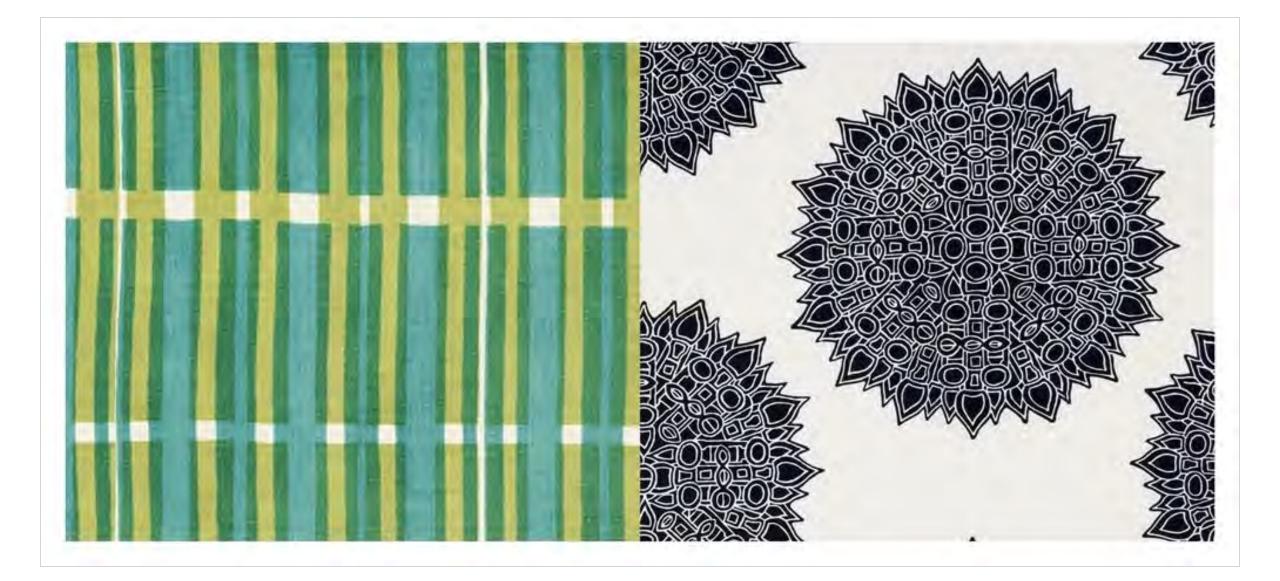
> Material shortages during and after the Second World War had a big impact on many textile makers and artists, especially weavers. If textile printers were able to get dyestuffs, they could work on ersatz fabrics

and textiles from the liner closet, such as sheets and white damask tablecloths, if the household could spare them.

After the dip in Danish textile printing during the Second World War, the craft enjoyed a vibrant post-war revival, as the first generations of graduates from the School of Arts and Crafts established their practices, took part in exhibitions in Denmark and abroad and sold their wares from outlets such as Den Permanente and Illums Bolighus in Copenhagen and the shops of Haandarbejdets Fremme, which were present around the country. In addition to the initial pioneers – Marie Gudme Leth, Gudrun Stig Auguard and Karen Schrader – practitioners included Ruth Christeesen, Helga Foght, Ruth Hull. Inge Ingetoft, Arne Jacobsen, Rolf Middelboe and Dorte Russchou, among others.

Despite the lingering war-time shortages, the demand for printed textiles was high. After a few years when society and industry had been forced to adapt to difficult conditions, austerity was replaced by boom time, and the market expanded to match the growing demand. The number of trained textile printers making yard goods for furnishing and clothing increased, and with the breakthrough of Danish Design around the world, the export markets too began to show an interest in Danish textile printing. The textile industry made a dedicated effort to market the textiles abroad, assisted by the large travelling exhibitions, including Design in Scandinavia: An exhibition of objects for the home, which was on the road from 1954 to 1957, and The Arts of Denmark from 1960 to 1961.

The patterns gradually moved away from the naturalist and romantic retro wave in favour of abstract or geometric textiles with small repeats in bright, crisp colours. While many patterns were previously printed in linen or synthetic fabrics, for example vistra, a heavy cotton quality now became the norm. Several classic patterns were created during this period. Some saw the 1950s as the decade of 'frank' designs – it was certainly a decade of pronounced optimism. Perhaps that was why collaborations between textile designers and industry were so successful during the 1950s. There was a strong preference for tasteful, versatile and high-quality textiles.



### Arne Jacobsen

From 1943 and into the 1960s, the architect Arne Jacobsen created a large number of printed textile designs. He began this production in 1943, during his year-time exile in Sweden. That same year, he married Jonna Jacobsen (née Maller), who had trained as a textile printer under Marie Gudme-Leth. Jonna Jacobsen helped develop Arne Jacobsen's drawings and watercolours into textile patterns. While in Sweden, he established a collaboration with Nordiska Kompaniet (NK), a Swedish department store founded in 1902. The textiles were created for NK's Textilkammare, which was headed by the Swedish textile artist. Astrid Sampe from 1937 to 1971. NK worked with some of the leading Nordic textile. designers. As early as 1944, the department. store held a large exhibition presenting itof Arne Jacobsen's printed patterns and framed design studies. This exhibition marked Arne Jacobsen's breakthrough as a teatile designer, and the Swedish Nationalmuseum bought sa patterns for their collection. Back in Denmark after the waz, Arme Jacobsen continued to design and paint patterns for printed textiles, which were produced by several Danish textile manufacturers, including Grantex. Textil-Lassen and, not least, C. Olesen's brand Cotil.

The same stylistic influences that characterize the patterns of most textile printers are also seen in Arne Jacobsen's textiles. Marie Godme Leth's botanical patterns were inspired by garden flowers. often arranged into bouquets and slightly stylized. Arne Jacobsen's plant metifs, on the other hand, were lush, wild nature with naturalist flowers and plants, sometimes entire plant environments. After his return from Sweden, the inspirations from wild nature were gradually replaced by patterns in which the repeat itself stood out more. His patterns for Cotil from the 1950s and 1960s had a supple, geometric and graphic expression.

The Heroic Age of Polar Exploration ((807-1023) occupies a significant place in the cultural imagination, often constructed as the ultimate test of embarance. heroism, and masculmity. This era is characterized by nationalism fersor, where expeditions to the North and South Poles became symbolic acrs of imperial conquest. For much of the twentieth century, these narratives were dominated by white male figures whose achievements were celebrated while follures were either crosed or reframed as noble acro of self-sacrifice." Island Julien's True North reclaims this historical narrative, offering a counter-narrative that centers on Marthew Herson, whose contributions were long overfooked due to the racul hierarchies of the time.

Julien's Tim North brings us back to the Henoic Age of exploration, a time when many of the Arctic regions had yet to achieve independent Indigenous self-povernance systems. The absence of this autonomy marked a stark colomal period, the implications of which linger even today, as seen in Nunavur's 1999 independence and Greenland's 2008 move toward self-governance while remaining part of Canada and Denmark, respectively. Julien's critique aliens with a broader movement within Arctic studies, which emphasizes that the heroic era cannot be viewed as entirely distinct from contemporary issues. Rather, these colonial and musculinist perspectives persist, subtly shaping ongoing political and environmental crises in the region."

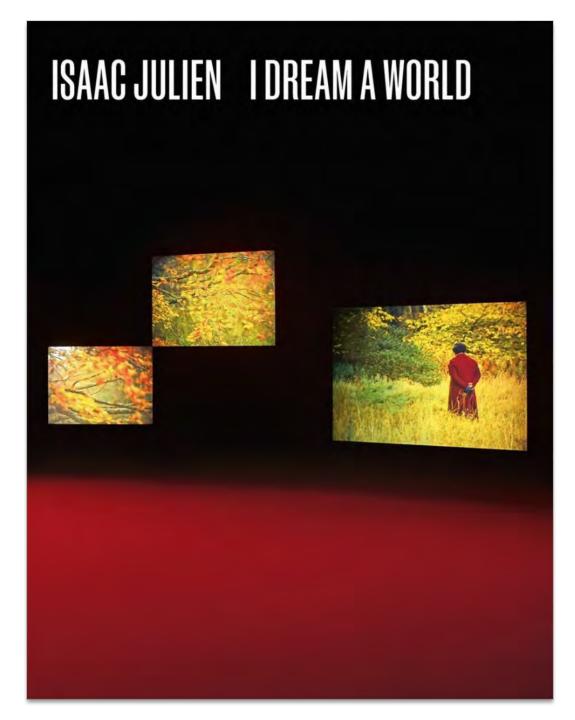

True to Henson's perspective, Julien uses a voice-over in the middle of the film from Henson's writings posthumously published in 1966 to continumicare the explorer's anxieties, especially after Peary's violent nutburst aimed at securing his own claim to the pole. The consequences of Pears's betrayal were profound for Henson, who struggled financially despite his pivotal role in the expedition. While Peary begrudgingly acknowledged Henson's contributtons in a brief hereword to A Negro Explorer at the North Pale (1912), Hermon endured years of hardship, working low-paying jobs before gaining some stahility as a clerk at the US Custom House in 1913. Although he received belated recognition later in life, including membership in The Explorers Club and the Peary Polar Expedition Medal, Henson's legacy was overshadowed by Pears's and his achievements undervalued during his lifetime."

Julien's The North thus rewrites these otherwise sanitized narratives by presenting Henson not as a subservient figure but as a reolient explorer confronting racial and social barriers. In The North, Julien sinuses thenson at the center of a narrative that frequently privileges white male bemissis, reconfiguring the story so that figures like Henson and the four Inuit men who accompanied Pears on the expedition - Egingwah, Ootah, Ooqueah, and Seeglost-become witnesses to Peary's achievement rather than silent participants. This approach shifts liscus to the integral, yet historically margittalized, contributions of nonwhite individuals, with Julien using visuals to understage their significant yet overlooked presence." We recasting Hensun and the Inuit men as control figures, Julien challenges the hierarchical part atives that have long dominated the discourse of polar exploration:

Foy has noted that this pseudoscientific notion functioned as an idealogical counterpart to Jim Crow segregation, limiting Black individuals to the tropical South while-suggesting they lacked the physical resilience for Arctic climates. Surrealisterne ville skabe en ny, mindre fornuftstyret verden med plads til fantasi og drømme, og heri indgik friere seksualitet som både mål og middel. Denne artikel vil undersøge, hvordan surrealisternes forestillinger om køn og seksualitet udtrykkes i Surrealismens tegning. Dette vil konkret ske gennem en ikonografisk analyse af en række af værkernes repræsentationer af mænd og kvinder, hvor især de mandlige surrealister, som står bag langt hovedparten af udstillingens værker, ofte har den nøgne kvindekrop - eller dele af den - som motiv. Et eksempel er Öscar Dominguez' tegneserie: De 4 lydige sfærer (inklusiv 2 på begunstigelsessøjlen) i en kvindes anatomi<sup>1</sup> (1943) [69]. Gennem seks tegninger undersøger Dominguez en kvindes anatomi. Først ser man kun bryster og baller (titlens "lydige sfærer"), hvor brysterne svæver frit i luften, og ballerne hviler på en piedestal. Derefter får man resten af kvinden at se i en legende, stillseret streg. Barnligt, muntert forsøger hun at fange en sommerfugl, Hun strækker og vender sig smidigt, men fikspunkterne forbliver de samme fire erotiske 'sfærer' for den mandlige tegner. Sådanne fremstillinger af kvinder som barnlige, spontane og erotiske finder man ofte i surrealismen, men når man dykker ned i udstillingens billeder, viser det sig dog snart, at der ikke blot er en forestilling om kvinden eller forholdet mellem kønnene; hverken for de mandlige eller kvindelige kunstnere.

Surrealisternes forhold til køn og seksualitet viser sig ikke blot i deres værker, men også i deres øvrige virke. Surrealismen var en avantgardebevægelse, der ønskede at ændre verden. I stedet for en autonom kunst uden andet formål end at være kunst, ønskede surrealisterne at skubbe til deres egen og betragterens virkelighedsopfattelse. Kunsten skulle ikke være et særskilt, 'fint' domæne, men hænge sammen med livet, række ind i livet. Det var derfor heller ikke vigtigt for surrealisterne at skabe kunst, der skulle holde for tid og evighed, hvorfor meget - som netop denne udstilling viser - blev skabt på billigt papir med ringe holdbarhed. Kunsten skulle være og virke her og nu, og en del blev slet ikke set som 'kunst'. Det gælder for eksempel de sakaldte automattegninger og fællestegninger, der indgår i udstillingen, hvoraf en del er resultatet af den populære leg cadavre exquis (på dansk; 'det udsøgte lig'), hvor deltagerne ikke ser, hvad de andre har tegnet eller skrevet, før alle er færdige, og papiret foldes ud.

Ligesom fællestegningerne er en integreret del af det surrealistiske projekt, er en række samtaler om seksualitet, som de nedskrev i slutningen af 1920'erne, det også. Som den britiske kunsthistoriker Dawn Ades påpeger i sit efterord til den engelske oversættelse af samtalerne, er de en vigtig kilde til forståelsen af surrealisternes tilgang til seksualitet og til deres opfattelse af kønnene,2 og inden vi dykker ned i værkerne fra Surrealismens tegning, skal vi først se nærmere på disse samtaler.

### SAMTALER OM SEKSUALITET

I årene 1928-30 afholdt surrealisterne 12 samtaler om seksualitet, som blev nedskrevet. De udspurgte hinanden om alt fra skam, onani og deres første seksuelle erfaringer, til hvilke samlejestillinger de foretrak. I alt 40 mennesker deltog i samtalerne, men kun surrealisternes leder, André Breton, deltog i dem alle. Ellers varierede antallet af deltagere fra 4 til 15, og kun i tre sessioner deltog der kvinder.3 Målet med samtalerne var at få en dybere indsigt i seksualitet gennem deling af seksuelle erfaringer og præferencer.

Ifølge Ades var denne type grupperesearch med til at skabe en fælles identitet i den surrealistiske gruppe, men det blev hurtigt klart, at deltagerne langt fra var enige om de spergsmål, der blev taget op. Homoseksualitet er for eksempel et ømtåleligt emne i gruppen. Nogle, herunder forfatteren Louis Aragon, ser det som "en seksuel tilbøjelighed som enhver anden",5 men

Breton ensker ikke, at det overhovedet diskuteres og truer med at gå, hvis der ikke skiftes emne. Han hæyder, at han bifalder alle seksuelle perversioner foruden denne. Denne erklærede omfavnelse af 'perversioner' hænger sammen med surrealisternes ønske om at nedbryde samfundsskabte hæmninger og normer. I samme ånd fremhæver flere en præference for analsex - både for at under graviditet og som et oprør mod reproduktiv, ægteskabelig sex.

Deltagernes seksuelle erfaringer er meget forskellige: Kathia Thirion siger, hun har haft tre seksualpartnere, digteren Paul Éluard hæyder at have haft 500-1000. Breton og forfatteren Pierre Unik kommer efter 20-40 sekunders penetration, mens forfatteren Benjamin Péret kan blive ved i et kvarter - i hvert fald anden gang.9 Péret og Breton afviser klart voldtægt, mens forfatteren Raymond Queneau siger, at det er det eneste, der tiltaler ham, og kunstneren Jacques Prévert finder voldtægt "legitim"." Nogle af disse svar er således rystende, andre kan pirre ens nyfigenhed. Selvom den alvorlige og omhyggelige nedskrivning af alt dette måske i dag kan virke patetisk, er samtalerne et interessant historisk dokument. Det er radikalt i 1920'erne at have en så åben og series samtale om seksualitet, og samtalerne siger også meget om kønnenes forhold til hinanden. I de første samtaler indgår der kun mænd, men kvinders seksualitet og orgasme er et centralt emne. Det allerførste spørgsmål i den første samtale er således, hvorvidt man som mand kan vide, om en kvinde har fået orgasme, og de diskuterer også, hvordan kvinden mon kan vide, at manden er kommet.10 Louis Aragon protesterer mod, at kvinderne ikke bliver spurgt selv. Han mener, det afspejler en ulighed, og at validiteten af det, der bliver sagt, undermineres af, at det hele kommer fra et mandligt synspunkt." Ingen af de øvrige tilstedeværende mænd tager dog notits af hans indvending. Mændene virker mere optagede af deres egne forestillinger om kvindens seksualitet. Breton hævder eksempelvis skrasikkert, at blot 5 % af kvinders orgasmer opstår gennem stimulering af klitoris.12

I de samtaler, hvor der rent faktisk deltager kvinder, siger de meget lidt, og når de siger noget, virker det ikke til, at der bliver lyttet til dem. De diskuterer for eksempel hvilke eksplicitte seksuelle billeder, man foretrækker, og mens mændene oftest siger bryster, baller eller kønnet. siger flere af kvinderne øjnene, hvorpå Breton protesterer og fastslår, at ejnene ikke er seksuelle. 13 Også kvindernes erfaring af egen orgasme bliver modsagt.24 Som Ades skiver om kvindernes deltagelse:

"De er ofte uenige med mændene, men selvom de ikke er tavse, er de på en måde stumme. Der er ingen tvivl om deres fuldgyldige deltagelse, lige seksuelle rettigheder eller deres ret til at tale åbent om deres egen seksualitet, hvilket de gør, men det er, som om de ikke bliver hørt, eller, hvis de gør, er det kun for at blive modsagt."

Ades påpeger modsætningen i, at seksuel frihed for de surrealistiske kvinder stadig betad, at de var fanget som tavse og ofte feticherede objekter for det mandlige blik.10 De bliver beundret, elsket og begæret, men oftere på baggrund deres udseende end som kunstnere i egen ret." Igen er der store forskelle mellem surrealisterne. Mens Aragon primært lægger vægt på kvinders udstråling, har Péret og Marcel Noll meget klare idéer om. hvordan en kvinde skal se ud, is og Breton siger:

"Kontemplation af en kvindes fysiske skønhed er det vigtigste i verden. En kvinde kan være et geni, kan legemliggøre alle de mentale egenskaber, jeg holder af, men det eneste, der skal til, for at jeg mister al interesse, er en enkelt fysisk detalje, som ikke behager mig."

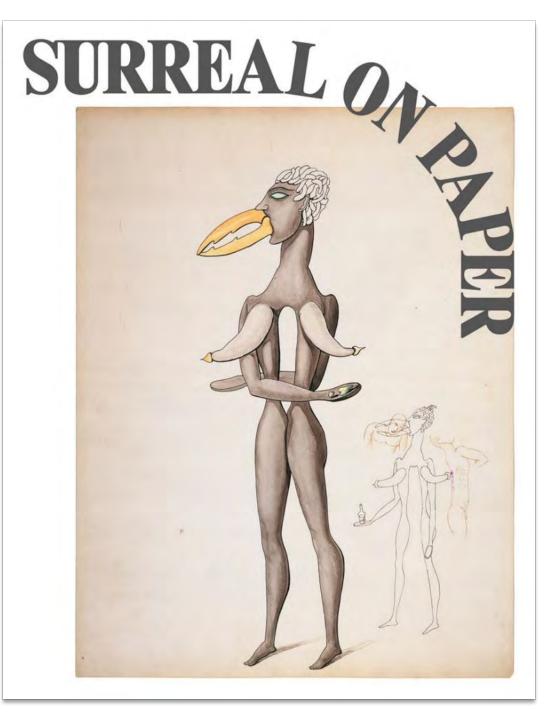
Mændenes fokus på kvindelig skønhed og erotiserede kropsdele ses også i deres billedkunst, der flyder over med bryster og baller og køn, der ikke behøver være tilkoblet et individ. Kvinden er, for en del af de

mandlige surrealister, primært objekt for hans begær og kærlighed, og i begge tilfælde projektionsflade for hans fantasier. Udstillingen byder således også på flere billeder af kvinden set i sværmeriske drømmesyn [52, 64, 65, 66, 77]. På den måde handler det reelt mere om manden selv end om kvinden. Når pennen i automattegning glider hen over papiret i et enske om at lade det ubevidste råde, ser vi hos både Yves Tanguy, André Masson og Camille Bryen, at der mellem stregernes mere eller mindre nonfigurative kruseduller opstår kvindebrystlignende former (moderens og/ eller den elskedes) [ 47-49]. Ifølge psykoanalytikeren Sigmund Freud, som surrealisterne var meget inspirerede af, er seksualiteten det undertrykte, der fylder mest i vores kultur, og i automattegningens villede kontroltab er det da ofte også den, der viser sig.

De kvindelige surrealister vender sjældent blikket den anden vei og objektgør manden, men der findes dog eksempler i blandt andet. Leonor Finis malerier af nøgne, sovende mænd [side 35], og i collagen Anatomilektionen (La Lecon d'amatomie) (1995) [60] undersøger Remedios Varo mandens krop. Collagen indeholder en række forskelligartede elementer: fire mænd med nøgne overkroppe og skitserede lunger; røntgenbilleder af lunger; en æggelignende form fyldt med fotos af lunger; samt en rorschachtest-lignende form (den psykologiske test rorschach var allerede velkendt på dette tidspunkt), der både kan ligne diverse væsener eller en rogsky, og í hvís ábninger et utal af ofne kigger ud. 'Rogskven' dækker eller gør det ud for mændenes underkroppe, og foran flere underliv er en udklippet mund eller indklæbede øjne. Collagen er morsom og overraskende. 'Røgen', røntgenbillederne og lungerne samler sig til et medicinsk tema om rygning, men røgskyen over deres underliv peger måske også på alt det, der ikke fortælles om i datidens anatomilektioner: Om lungerne kan man få en Indgående viden, men om mændenes penis og seksualitet kun en sløret forestilling, hvilket genererer både nysgerrighed (øjnene), lyst (munden) og fantasier (væsenerne).



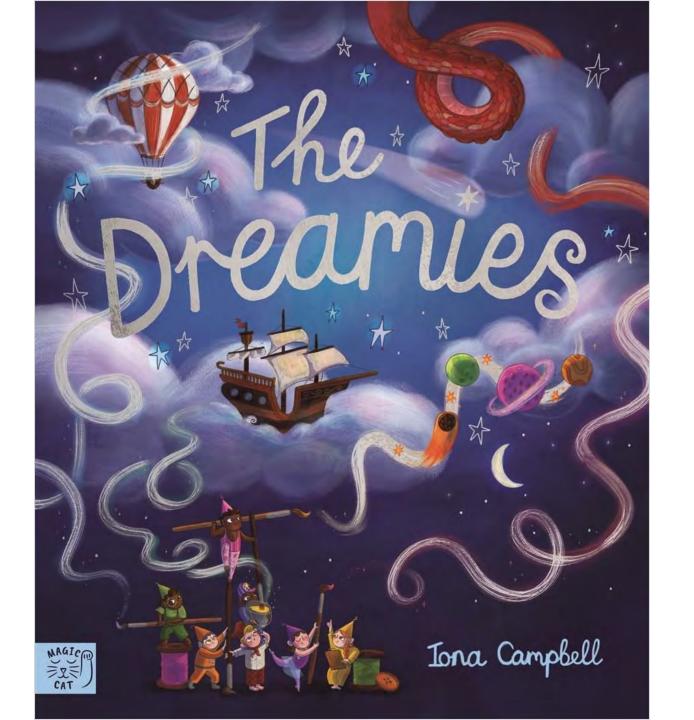

## **CLOACA MAXIMA**

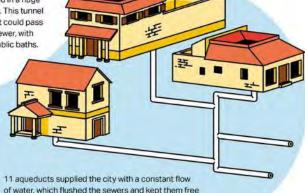

The Ancient Romans were the first to build a sewer system on a large scale. In the 6th century BC, a simple sewer was constructed to drain the marshlands in the centre of Rome and to carry stormwater down to the River Tiber, which ran beside the city. It was mostly made of open-air channels lined with brick.

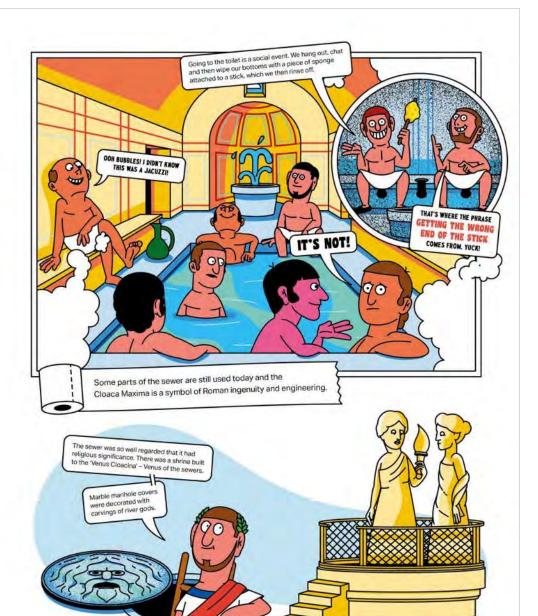


As the city expanded, the waste problem became more serious, so the wealthy empire invested in a huge vaulted sewage tunnel – the Cloaca Maxima. This tunnel was 1600 m long and was so wide, a haycart could pass through it. The city was built on top of the sewer, with pipes connecting it to private homes and public baths.





11 aqueducts supplied the city with a constant flow of water, which flushed the sewers and kept them free of obstructions. The Cloaca Maxima then drained the wastewater into the Tiber River.



# THE LOST ART OF GONG FARMING

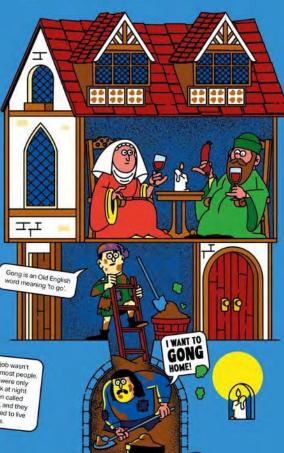
1400 - 1700 AD

As European cities grew bigger and more crowded, they also became dirtier. Public toilets, called latrines, were built... but not many. In the 1500s, London had only 16 public latrines for a population of about 40.000 people.



Wealthier people found their own solution by building cesspits under their homes. These pits were made of materials that allowed liquids to drain away, leaving the solid waste behind. Every few years, someone had to dig out the waste. This unpleasant and dangerous job was done by workers known as gong farmers.





It also carried many risks. The cesspits they worked in were often poorly built and had no ventilation. In some cases, gong farmers drowned when parts of the cesspit collapsed.



There were strict rules about how the waste had to be disposed of. In London, it was taken to a wharf where it was loaded onto barges and carried away from the city.

In other places, the waste was spread on open land just outside the town, in areas known as sewage farms.

One gong farmer, who just dumped his stinking load, was punished by being buried up to his neck in a pipe filled with gong and put on public display.









Modern sewage systems are designed to clean water safely, protect nature and even recycle waste into useful things. When you flush the toilet, or drain water from your sink, it travels through underground pipes to a sewage treatment plant. There, it goes through several steps to make it safe before it goes back into nature.





#### GETTING RID OF BIG STUFF

First, large items like plastic, wipes and other debris are removed using screens and grit chambers.



#### SEPARATING SOLIDS AND LIQUIDS

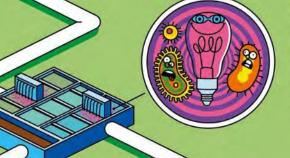
Next, the sewage sits in big tanks. Heavy waste, like poo and food scraps, sink to the bottom as sludge. Oily stuff floats to the top. Both are taken away. The liquid that remains is called effluent.





### **CLEANING THE WATER WITH MICROBES**

Tiny living microbes and bacteria are added to the remaining liquid. They eat a lot of the contaminants, helping to clean the effluent.





### EXTRA CLEANING

In some places, the effluent gets extra cleaning to remove more germs and chemicals. This might include filtering it or using special lights (UV) or chlorine to kill any remaining bacteria.





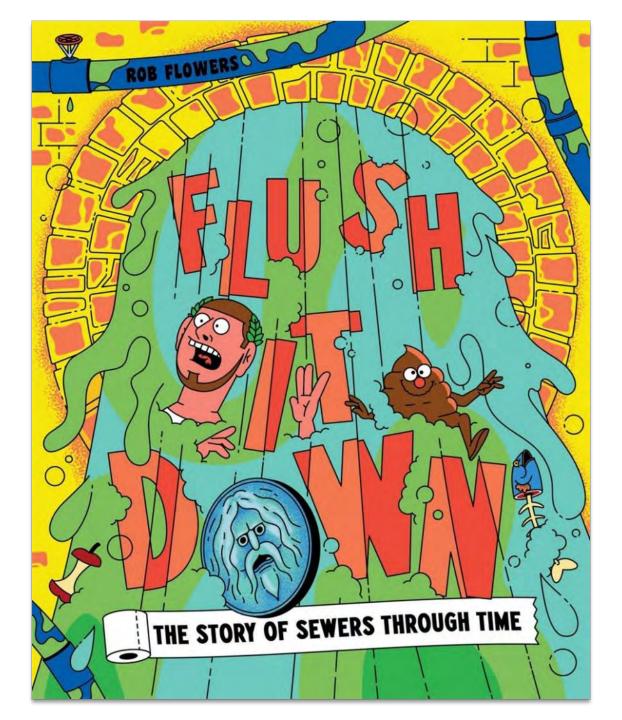






### WHAT HAPPENS TO THE SOLIDS?
